



Happy Easter everyone! He is Risen ALLELUIA! The Gospel accounts both at the Easter Vigil and at Easter Sunday Mass proclaim the incredible reality that the tomb is empty. We will spend the next fifty days of the Easter season exploring what this empty tomb means for you and me. He is no longer dead, but alive.

The Marian Antiphon we sing during the Easter season instead of the Angelus (at noon and 6 pm – if you've ever noticed that is when our church bells ring calling us to prayer) is a beautiful prayer for us this beautiful Easter morning:

Queen of Heaven

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.
Has risen, as he said, alleluia.
Pray for us to God, alleluia.
Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.

Projects at St. Gabriel Church: A video explanation from Fr. Tyler along with detailed information is available on our website. There is a need to replace the windows of the church which are from the 1890s. The biggest issue is the high water level which is causing severe damage to the foundation of the church. We need to dry out the crawlspace in order to save St. Gabriel's foundation. Donations toward these projects will be greatly appreciated. Project Updates:

Maria Hall renovation is coming along well. The building plans have been approved and finalized and now contractors are beginning to submit their bids. We have raised \$49,412 in total funding for the project so far (including the seed donation of \$25,000 and \$15,000 in matching gifts. If in the coming weeks we raise an additional \$5,000, we will reach our first goal from the matching gifts. Thank you, everyone, for your amazing generosity!

St. Gabriel crawlspace and window project: To date we have raised \$7,772 toward the projects. Thank you, everyone, for your generosity! The windows are scheduled to be installed at the end of April. The crawlspace work should be starting around the same time.

Divine Mercy Sunday

The 8th day of Easter is celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. Starting on Good Friday there is a novena of prayers to help us prepare to enter into the mystery of Jesus' Divine Mercy for the whole world. Each day of the novena, Fr. Tyler will post a short video reflection and prayer. On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 11th at 3 PM there will be a Holy Hour, Confession, and singing of the Diving Mercy Chaplet at St. Catherine in Ossineke.

Saint of the Week- Saint Magdalen of Canossa-Feast Day April 10. This foundress, born to a noble family in Verona, Italy, lost her father at age 5 and was abandoned by her mother when she remarried. Choosing religious life over an advantageous marriage, Magdalen first joined the Carmelites, but left when she saw that their strict rules of enclosure would prohibit her charitable works. She began a new community, the Canossian Daughters of Charity, in 1799 by bringing two poor girls into her own home. The institute spread throughout Italy, and Magdalen helped found an order of priests and a third order for laypeople. Canossians minister today in Italy, Latin America and the Philippines. Magdalen, who was canonized in 1988, famously said, "Those who love are never tired, since love knows no burden."
