### **DEARLY BELOVED**

Opening Prayer: May we not be contented with what we already know about Jesus, but that we may constantly try to know and understand him more deeply and accept him as He is

#### **READINGS:**

The passage concerning the Suffering Servant in our first reading today provides the background for the revelation of Jesus as the suffering Messiah. The Gospel reading relates Peter's acknowledgment and confession about Jesus as "the Christ (Messiah), the Son of the living God." It still goes on to relate Jesus's prediction of his passion, death and Resurrection and his teaching on what we must do if we are to follow him: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me." It is clear then why the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 116) invites us to turn to the Lord for help amidst the trials of this world, since it is in God that we will find deliverance from trouble and relief from our afflictions. The second reading from the Letter of James reminds us that suffering is something to be accepted and to be alleviated.

#### THE CALL TO KNOW JESUS MORE AND MORE:

The readings today reveal who Jesus truly and really is. We get to know about Jesus from what Peter says about him and the announcement Jesus makes about himself. Other ways we can grow and deepen our knowledge and our relationship with Jesus is when we listen to Jesus through daily meditative reading of Holy Scriptures, when daily we speak to Jesus in our individual and family prayers, when we try to attend the weekday and Sunday Mass, when we try to find time to participate in eucharistic Adoration of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, when we seek to ask God for forgiveness for our sins at the end of the day and to reconcile ourselves with Jesus through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

#### WHAT JESUS CAME TO DO AS THE CHRIST/MESSIAH:

When Peter declared by confessing his faith that Jesus is the Christ (Messiah), the Son of the living God," Jesus went on to revealed himself to his Apostles and to us too by announcing that His mission was to accept unjust persecution and death at the hands of the religious leaders. Jesus connected messiahship with death and suffering when he revealed himself as one who will suffer, be rejected, be killed, and rise after three days. This way Jesus wanted the Apostles and us to understand that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer and die in order that God's work of redemption might be accomplished. Jesus broke the powers of sin and death by his humiliation, suffering, and death and won eternal life and freedom from the slavery of sin and from the oppression of the evil one-Satan. Jesus allowed himself to suffer for a greater good-which is our salvation.

#### ACCEPTING OUR SUFFERING AS A SHARE IN THE VICTORY OF CHRIST:

Our faith as Christian is tested by suffering. Christians are called to accept their suffering and offer them up to God as their own share in the passion and death of Christ. By embracing the sufferings/odds/dislikes of their lives which they face every day, disciples of Jesus transform their suffering and see them as a sharing in the glorious passion of Christ. This is what Christ meant when Jesus told his disciples they must deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow him. Hence, we are challenged like the Apostles to see suffering from the divine perspective so that whenever we suffer as Christians, especially on account of our faith, we see our suffering with the eyes of God, not the eyes of men. We must see the divine blessings that accompany our sufferings and accept those suffering of ours in accord with the great mystery of the plan of God.

#### **FACING OUR SUFFERING WITH FAITH:**

We face our suffering with faith when our response to suffering is determined by our faith. The point here is for Christians to handle their suffering with faith. Handling or managing our suffering with faith means seeing and treating suffering that befall us with faith or as people who trust in God. Our way of life, our way of dealing with suffering becomes an illustration of the strong faith we have in Christ. Our faith affects our approach to life, especially the way we respond to our own personal suffering or the suffering that other people face.

#### **CALLED TO ALLEVIATE THE SUFFERINGS OF OTHERS:**

Disciples of Jesus come to the aid of the less privileged and do not just depend on profession of their faith. They do not live by professing Lord, Lord, but live by performing good works which help to rid the suffering in the lives of other people. Today's second reading from the Letter of James, reminds us that suffering is not only something to be accepted but also something to be alleviated. Faith in Jesus, the Messiah, should help us to ease the sufferings of others through works of mercy, either corporal or spiritual. Professing faith in the Divinity of Christ as our Redeemer is useless, unless we practice that faith in genuine deeds of the love, mercy, forgiveness, and humble service lived and demonstrated. Therefore, Christians are not only to profess their faith in God, but they are obliged to meet the material needs of the poor in their midst and by so doing eliminate suffering. Disciples of Jesus respond concretely to the needs and sufferings of their fellow humans. Without doing so, their faith becomes all talk and no action: "Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

Closing Prayer: May we accept our suffering as a share in the suffering of Christ, accept it with faith and as people of Faith alleviate the suffering of others.


