PARISHES OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

DEARLY BELOVED

Opening Prayer: May we become patient, prudent and tolerant of others just as God is understanding, tolerant, and welcoming with every one of us.

READINGS: Today's first reading from the Book of numbers which derives its name from the numbering of the tribes of Israel through census on two different occasions, deals with two sets of people. First, there is the 70 elders who were formally commissioned, who received the spirit of leadership and spoke in the name of God. Second, we have two persons who were not formally commissioned, but were inspired to lead and speak in the name of God. In the case of two people who were not formally commissioned but received the spirit and prophesied like the 70 elders, an objection was raised by Joshua. Moses ruled in their favor that no one should be biased or jealous. In today's Gospel, the Apostle John raised an objection against non-Christian exorcists who operated and expelled demons and performed miracles in the name of Jesus. In answer to the complaint by an Apostle, Jesus himself like Moses ruled that anyone who expels demons or performs miracle in the name of Jesus, even if not of his company is free to do so. Jesus justifies those who act in His name, he justifies the works of mercy performed in his name and called on those who believe in his name not to be the cause of scandal.

GOD'S SPIRIT, GOD'S GIFT, GOD'S BLESSING, BLOWS ANYWHERE IT WILLS: Joshua thought and believed that the spirit upon Moses would be imparted only on the 70 elders at the tent of meeting. Similarly, the Apostle John felt and assumed that only the apostles and other close companions of Jesus had the gift of the Spirit to cast out demons. However, both Joshua and St. John were wrong, because God and God alone can decide on whom he confers his gifts. The Spirit of the Lord moves or acts as God wishes. God always bestows his gifts, his blessings, and his Spirit to all whom he wishes without limit. God's gifts, Gods' blessing and God's Spirit is like the wind that blows wherever it wills. To explain how the spirit works Jesus used the wind which serves as a symbol of the Spirit. The wind is invisible. The wind blows always. The wind cannot be controlled and is unpredictable. Like the wind, God and His Spirit cannot be controlled. The Spirit flows everywhere and is felt by everyone. No one can predict when the Spirit can invade the human heart. The works of the Spirit falls within the authority of God and not men. Only God can control the work of the Spirit and to whoever God wishes to grant the Spirit, he grants it. So also are the gifts of God and his blessing, they are experienced by whoever God decided to bestow them on.

NO ROOM FOR JEALOUSY AMONGST CHRISTIANS: In today's first reading, the attitude of Joshua, Moses' aide and Moses's response provides us with an example and a warning about Jealousy. In a likewise manner, the jealousy of the Apostles voiced by John is evident when he complained and attempted to reserve God's love and healing power to the Apostles as "sole owners" and "authorized distributors." Moses's successor, Joshua and the Apostles represented by John fell into the trap of jealousy because in their own case they felt bad, ill will of the men who were succeeding in what they did. Jealousy is evident here because they had desired that someone be deprived of a gift because they cannot have it and is not one of them. Those who are jealous entertain negative/harmful/bad feelings about others when they are promoted, paid better or rewarded. People who are jealous are not happy when another person is progressing or successful. A jealous person is full of joy when another person gets punished or losses what they have. It was Jealousy that led to the death of Abel at the hands of his own brother Cain. Jealousy nearly claimed the life of Joseph until he was lucky and sold as a slave by his own brothers. Jealousy almost caused the death of David at the hands of king soul. Jealousy is part of the 10th commandment.

MISUSE OF OUR AUTHORITY, OUR PROPERTY AND OUR BODY: Civil leaders have the obligation towards the citizenry as it pertains to employment, just wages, and remuneration. As people who trust in God and are endowed with Spiritual authority, authority must be managed carefully, humbly, and justly, since God bestows his Spirit on us and we are endowed with the laws of right and wrong. As regards the use of property owned by Christian, Jesus declared that any kindness shown and any help given to those in need would not lose its reward. Jesus never refused to give to anyone in need who asked for his help. Disciple of Jesus are called to be kind and generous like Jesus. Jesus's teaching about the misuse of the body is found in today's Gospel where he states: *"If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off. And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out." Christians are invited not to lead others into scandal and sin. In fact, it would be better if we had "a great millstone"* put around our neck and thrown into the sea, than to cause another to sin. Hence, our hands become instruments of sin because of what we touch and how we touch those things. Our feet are used for sin when they take us to places we shouldn't go. Our eyes become doorways for sin when we deliberately decide to look lustfully. Rather than mutilating these parts of the body, we are invited shed off bad habits. Jesus's startling words about self-mutilation, means that we must cut out of our lives all practices that keep us away from God and retain only those habits that draw us closer to God. We are to integrate our bodies into following of Christ, so that our hands, feet, and eyes help us to imitate and follow Christ more closely. Nothing is worth jeopardizing our eternal life with Jesus. Hence, we must be ready to part with anything which causes us to sin and which leads us or others to spiritual death.

Closing Prayer: May we be open minded and tolerant of all who we meet in this life.
