

DEARLY BELOVED-

Opening Prayer: May we always listen and be obedient to the Lord who gives us orders that there is no commandment greater than love of God with our whole being and love of our neighbour as ourselves.

INTRODUCTION AND READINGS: Since God alone is our strength and our stronghold, the Responsorial Psalm for today from Psalm 18 call our attention to love of God with our whole strength: "I love you Lord, my strength." This prayer of the psalmist is further reiterated by Jesus who when asked: "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Answered by replying: "The first is this: Hear. O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The first part of this response by Jesus repeats what we have in our first reading about the love of God with entire heart, soul, mind, and strength: "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today." Since the Love of God (the love of Jesus too) is with the entire heart, soul, and strength, the second reading presents Jesus as the High Priest who is holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners and whose priesthood does not pass away.

WORKING FOR THE GLORY OF GOD AND THE WELL-BEING OF OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS: Today's scripture readings remind us of one of the supreme truths in the Bible, that is, that there are only two demands. The love of God and the love of our neighbour. The two demands are fundamentally interconnected. The steadfast love of neighbour springs from the love of God, and on the other hand, there can be no true love of God that does not express itself in the love of neighbour. It is better than any sacrifices. When we easily allow ritual to take the place of love we end up with a loveless religion. For the Christian failure to love is a significant failure. For Jesus loving God and loving our fellow human beings at the same time is the basis for true religion. It is by showing genuine, active love for our neighbours that we can demonstrate that we really love God. Hence, we cannot say that we truly love God if we do not love our fellow human being nor can we truly love our fellow human being if we do not love God.

THE CHRISTIAN DUTY TO LOVE GOD WITH ALL OF OUR BEING: In establishing the commandment of loving the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, Jesus cites the first sentence of the Jewish Shema Prayer: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Dt 6: 4). Love of God with the whole of one's being, that is, with all of one's heart, soul, mind, and strength deals with man's spontaneous response to God as God. In human terms what is loved here is God who is Divine. The love of God in this sense is possible because it is the love of the human person as it is directed to the Divine Being-God. The Christian in this case totally engages himself/herself to the love of God by directing his love towards God the Creator who is in heaven. God is God but the Christian is able to love the almighty God who is Spirit by keeping the commandments of God, offering prayers of thanksgiving, praise, contrition, and petition to God, reading and reflecting on the Holy Scriptures which contain the words of God, and practice of the sacraments since they are instituted by Christ. The love of God is possible for the human being when there a place for religion, worship, sacredness/holiness, purity, and prayer. In this case God and his will takes precedence not mine. Things and people affiliated to us must not come between us and God.

THE CHRISTIAN DUTY TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER: This is a loving relationship with other human beings because they are creatures of God. As a complementary norm to the love of God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, Jesus declares the love of neighbour as oneself by citing the book of Leviticus: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself" (Lev. 19:18). The love of neighbour deals with man's spontaneous response to other human beings. Love in this case is exercised between those that are living here on earth and such love is other directed because it is concerned with relationships between humans as children of God. Put in an ordinary, common, practical, or plain terms, the love of one's own neighbour is expressed mostly in deeds done not simply in thoughts, feelings, or presumption. The love of a person for his fellow human being becomes a reality when we share, help, support, encourage, forgive, and pray for each other. There are times when the love of neighbour will cost us suffering or demand that we ask for pardon when we offend another person or demand that we go out of our way to reach out to others.

Closing Prayer: May the Lord bless us and enable us to love him with our whole being and to love our neighbour as we love ourselves.
