DEARLY BELOVED - INTRODUCTION TO THE READINGS: Today 30th Sunday in Ordinary time, Year B, we who also experience the good things of the Lord in our life repeat the response to today's psalm: "The Lord

has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." While the psalm (126) and its response acknowledge the return of the Israelites from exile, it is the first reading which provides us with details as to why the Lord is acknowledged for accomplishing great things. The Lord brought back the captives of Zion. Among the captives or remnant that the Lord brought back from the land of the north are the weak such as the blind, the lame, the mothers, and those with child. While the Lord is acknowledged and praised for the return of the captives/remnants amongst which are the blind, Jesus makes his final journey to Jerusalem through Jericho and fulfils the prophecy of Jeremiah by curing the blind man-Bartimaeus by simply declaring: "Go your way; your faith has saved you."

EXILED FROM GOD: A primary example of people who were exiled in the Bible is when the children of Israel were exiled from their home to Babylon for 70 years. Adam and Eve were also exiled from God when they were banished from the Garden of Eden. Because of Adam and Eve, we are all living in exile away from the presence of God. Had Adam and Eve not fallen by eating the forbidden fruit we would have been enjoying the presence of God. Exile was there before Jesus came and with his coming he ended it (but it took a different form) by proclaiming the Gospel about the kingdom of God: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1: 14-15). Like the Israelites in Babylon, Christians who are disciples of Christ are described as aliens and exiles (1 Peter 2: 11). Until the return of Jesus or until we go to be with Jesus Christians are always away from the Lord; we are never at home because our citizenship is in heaven (Philippians 3: 20). Even though Christians are children of God their sins can keep them away or exiled from their God. Hence, those who believe in God can exile themselves from God when they commit sin.

GOD IS THE FOUNDATION OF OUR LIVES: In every situation that God dealt with his children as individuals or as a group he is the one who takes the initiative or the first step, since in the last analysis it is God who saves. God was the one who took the first step in leading the Israelites into Egypt (after Joseph was sold as a slave by his brothers and there was famine in the land). The liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and the leading the children of Israel from exile in Babylon were also initiated by God. Another practical example of how God takes the first initiative is the healing of the blind man-Bartimaeus. In taking the first initiative to deal with his children, God draws people to himself allowing them to become close to him and be better.

OUR RESPONSE TO GOD: Children of God must respond to God who takes the first step by moving towards God and reaching out to him. The captives or remnants of Israel, including the blind, the lame, the mothers with child and even Bartimaeus all took to the road and moved towards the Lord. The Israelites in exile were moved to the house of the Lord in Jerusalem. Bartimaeus by his insistent plea brought himself to the Lord Jesus from whom he regained his sight. It is faith that make us move towards God. This faith which makes us move towards God is what leads us unto salvation. Hence, faith by which we are led towards God and which is necessary for salvation must be deepened or sustained through prayer, practice of the sacraments, good works, daily Scripture reading and daily reflection.

MOVING TOWARDS THE LORD GOD, SUSTAINED BY FAITH IN THE LORD GOD AND PERSERVERING IN PRAYER TO THE LORD GOD: The readings for 30th Sunday offer us the opportunity to reflect on three things. First, we are called to always be on the move towards God or to reach out to him. Just as the Israelites travelled back to Jerusalem and Bartimaeus pleaded and was brought to Jesus, we too need to try to find God, reach out to him and be close to him. Our relationship with God is not to be static but we must try get close and close to God. Just as God was needed by the Israelites as well as by Bartimaeus, so we need him in our lives also because without him we can do nothing. As we come to the end of the liturgical year the readings offer us the chance to reflect on the progress we have made in our spiritual journey with God. Have we grown in our relationship with God? How close are we with God? Have we exiled or cut ourselves off from God? Second, since closeness to God is determined by the quality of our own faith in the Lord God, this Sunday also offer us the chance to see if we have grown in the practice of our faith or how we have matured in the Lord as we are about to end the liturgical year and during this pandemic. Bartimaeus had faith, which he kept, professed, and witnessed to. The healing obtained by Bartimaeus in today's Gospel shows us the significance of faith in our lives and the need to be strong in the faith by keeping it, professing it and bearing authentic witness to the faith. Third, today we are made to understand that we also need to persevere in prayer to God like Bartimaeus who humbly presented himself to Jesus: "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." Besides the need for us to have deep faith in God, we are also called today to continue to call on God for help, to repeatedly cry out to God for mercy, never giving up because when we cry to him for mercy his compassion will always be with us.
