DEARLY BELOVED

Opening Prayer: May the Lord help us grow and become His children who are ready to totally renounce everything, store up treasures in Heaven and follow him.

READINGS: The prayerful wish of the psalmist to be filled with love, wisdom of heart, kindness, the care, and other good things of the Lord (Psalm 90), is repeated in the prayer of for prudence and spirit of wisdom, presumably by King Solomon (first reading). The human desire to be filled with the good things only God can give is further illustrated in the Gospel reading when the young man came to Jesus pleading about what he should do to gain eternal life. The young man confessed to have kept all the commandments, but when Jesus told him to go and sell his possession, give the money to the poor and follow Jesus, the young man went away sad because he had great wealth. The young man lost everything because besides the fact that his possessions had “possessed” him. His treasure and hope for salvation were misplaced. The young man worshiped his wealth more than God and his riches had built a wall between himself and God. In the second reading the vital force and what the word of God can do is described as living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart.

GROWING IN THE LORD AS A CHRISTIAN SO AS TO OBTAIN SALVATION: Christian growth is not only computed physically in terms of years (how old we get), or in terms of height (how tall we get), or in terms of weight (how many kilos we weigh up) or in terms of our savings (how much money or shares we have). Growth, especially for the Christian is to be spiritual in Lord. There are two ways a Christian can spiritually grow and become good in the Lord so that salvation is obtained.

THE GENERAL/UNIVERSAL CALL TO GROW IN THE LORD AND BE SAVED: To be saved, there are certain acts which Christians accomplish every day in their lives which helps them to strive to generally grow spiritually in the Lord. On a daily and regular basis Christians observe certain things like keeping the commandments, daily prayers to God, regular reading of the Holy Scripture, regular church attendance, authentic Christian witness, trusting God, being obedient to God, love of God, love of neighbor and practice of the sacraments. A practical example of one of the many things we are generally always asked to do to grow in the Lord as contained in today’s Gospel is the keeping of the commandments. Although doing these things will bring us to generally grow in the lord, there are those other types of circumstances that we are expected to promptly respond so that through the grace of God we grow and are saved.

THE RADICAL CALL TO GROW IN THE LORD AND BE SAVED: Growth in the Lord also take place radically or instantaneously and how we respond immediately in this situation matters a lot. At this stage Christians are individually or specifically called to grow in the Lord or to respond to the grace of God working in their lives. A practical example of a radical moment when we are invited to respond to the grace of God and allow ourselves to grow in the lord is when in today’s Gospel Jesus noticed the potential in the young man, looked at him with love and admiration and offered him a new vision of goodness-and told him, ‘If you want to be perfect, sell what you have, give it to the poor. ‘Then come back and follow me, and you will have treasure in heaven.’ Although Jesus wanted to free the young man from his addiction to possessions and show him the path of sharing and compassion, the young man was not ready for it and so he went away sad. Other examples of moments when God immediately calls us to greater holiness or grace include occasions when something in us tells us to be more patient and tolerant. When we are made to think we should be more generous with our time and talents. When sometimes we are inspired to forgive someone. When something tells us to go and participate in a volunteer work in the community or to be attentive and more tolerant of a friend or member of your family or community. When suddenly I realize the need to be reconciled with God in the sacrament of reconciliation. Other moments of the radical call to grow in the Lord are when we realize that we need to bless our marriage or frequent the Church or get my child/children baptized/make first Holy Communion/be confirmed. These radical moments of grace may be motivated by the words of the Scriptures, advice from a friend/relation, a talk from a good Christian radio or television program, a sermon in the Church, the life of a saint or even the loss of a brother/friend/relation. We required to take any of these ways God is reaching out to us in these ways seriously and then do what we are inspired by the grace of God to do. While we may be tempted to put things off, drift along and do nothing, nonetheless, it is better to act on these crucial turning moments in our lives. This was what the young man refused to do and the rest remains just a story to tell. The essence of the Christian faith is to trust God and while relying on God let go of our old values and by so doing acquire a new relationship with God. If we fear losing the pleasure of the world we live in, we will never taste the joys of the unknown. Jesus demands the best of us as he did of the young man.

Closing Prayer: May we never be satisfied with what we daily accomplish but reorder our priorities and respond to the grace of God calling us to radically grow and obtain eternal life.
