DEARLY BELOVED- Opening Prayer: May we free ourselves from spiritual dullness, from indifference, and every distraction that will keep us away from welcoming Christ into our hearts.

INTRODUCTION AND READINGS: Today's first reading for first Sunday of Advent infers the coming of the Lord by his birth and sees it as a fulfilment of the promise made to the house of Israel and Judah. While the Israelites were still in exile, the prophet in this reading reminds them that God will fulfil his promise about bringing them back from exile and fulfil the promise about the Messiah made to Abraham, David, and their descendants. This promise to the Jews we Christians see fulfilled in Jesus as we wait for the coming of Christ in the flesh as well as his final coming in glory. In today's Gospel reading Jesus recounts how the world will end and his Second Coming in majesty on the clouds. Jesus tells us to look up, raise our heads, never allow our hearts to be weighed down, but to rather to watch, to pray and to be strengthened for our salvation draws near. In the second reading St. Paul reassures us today as he encouraged the early Thessalonian Christian community, that as we wait for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, we are to grow in the love of God and neighbor, learn to conduct ourselves in a way that is pleasing to God and allow ourselves to be strengthened in our hearts by trying to remain blameless and holy before God. The responsorial psalm: "To you, O Lord, I lift my Soul" shows us how to turn to God especially during this time of Advent. The rest of the psalm (Psalm 25) express how to turn to God by lifting our souls to God, by striving to know his ways, by allowing ourselves to be guarded and taught about the truth, by allowing ourselves to be shown the way and by keeping his laws and decrees.

To wait for the Lord who comes to free us: The coming of Christ grant us the opportunity to welcome him into our lives. When we allow Jesus to come into our lives, we will be liberated from that which distorts, disfigures, imprisons, and possesses us. This Holy season of advent provides us with the opportunity to avail ourselves of the greatest and most important gift God to us all, which is, the gift of Jesus Himself. Jesus comes to us in the incarnation to free us from sin and death as well as at the end of time to lead us to the Father's house. Advent is a time of liberation and salvation for all who are children of God because by the coming of Christ we are set free: "So if a son frees you, then you will truly be free" (John 8: 36). We are invited to make this Advent a time when we get to make our hearts ready for God to dwell therein. We welcome Jesus into our hearts especially during the period of advent by our commitment to prayer, our dedication to spiritual exercises, by daily reading and reflection on the word of God, by deliberate effort to practice of the sacraments and by changing our attitude concerning charity, kindness, and thanksgiving to God.

TO STAND UP STRAIGHT AND RAISE OUR HEADS: As we wait and prepare for the coming of our Lord Jesus in the flesh and at the end of time Jesus tells us that we must stand up straight and raise our heads. This means that we should not allow ourselves to be distracted and caught up in our normal activities of life like excessive pleasure, worries, preoccupations and desire for material things. Since the Lord is coming, we are to wake up from our slumber and fix our minds on receiving Christ into our lives. As we wait for the coming of Christ we are called to therefore stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand (Luke 21: 28). That the Lord is coming therefore means that we should sit up and accomplish something good with our lives.

TO BE ON OUR GAURD, TO WATCH AND TO PRAY CONSTANTLY: The process of the waiting and preparing for the coming of the Lord still require that we are on our guard, that we try to stay awake and pray always. Individuals, friends, neighbors, groups, families, are called upon during this period of advent to try to stay awake and to always pray. We should not be afraid of the Lord's coming but wait for the coming of Jesus with confidence, vigilance, and prayer. In other words, the closer we draw to the second coming of Christ, we should not slack off and become spiritually idle, lazy, indifferent, or inattentive to the fact that we are called to turn to God.

TO INCREASE AND ABOUND IN LOVE AND BE BLAMELESS IN OUR LIVES: Besides being on our guard and praying always as we wait for the coming of the Lord, waiting and preparing for the Lord's coming according to St. Paul also demands that we increase and abound in love as well as be blameless in holiness before God our Father. We increase and abound in love during this period of advent when we exercise love towards each other sharing our resources, talents, strength, and time with the less privileged. Hence, St. Paul exhorts us to let the Lord come more fully into our lives this Advent, so that his love in us may increase and overflow into the lives of those around us. It is this exercise of Christian charity that will lead us to living a blameless and holy lives.

Closing Prayer: May God bless and help us fix our eyes on him, open our ears to his voice and open our hearts to his glorious presence.
