DEARLY BELOVED- Opening Prayer: Having been blessed with possessions of all kinds may we strive to share with others what we have been able to acquire in this world with the help of God.

INTRODUCTION AND READINGS: The response to the Psalm for today: "*Praise the Lord, my soul,*" express a prayer of praise and thanksgiving to God for the deliverance of his children-the Israelites. The Psalm itself (Psalm 146) goes on to acknowledge and celebrate God for keeping faith forever, securing justice for the oppressed, giving food to the hungry, setting captives free, giving sight to the blind, raising the lowly, loving the just, protecting strangers, sustaining the fatherless and the widow, and thwarting the way of the wicked. In the first reading it is a human being, a poor woman who is acknowledged, commended, and rewarded wonderfully by the Lord God because she accepted to feed the prophet in the name the Lord from the last bit of what she had to live on. In the Gospel reading for today Jesus also recognized and praised a poor widow who gave out all she had to live on: "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." As we eagerly wait for the coming of Christ, let us do so by sharing what we have with the Church of Christ and with others out of reverence for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who offered himself for us once and for all.

BEING READY TO GIVE GOD AND OTHERS OUR ALL IN ALL: To show us how best to give or contribute Jesus gave us examples of two widows in the first and the Gospel reading who unselfishly gave out what they had or from the least of their material possessions. What is unique with the way these widows gave is that they both gave what they needed, that is, their very last or from the little they had. Everybody, those who have more than they need or those who have little, have something to give to another person. Besides, God invites us to give not only from the things we have such as money and possessions but to give also of our strength, time, and talents. Christians are encouraged to be generous to others not just with what they have in abundance but even with the last of what they have or even their necessities. Those who are truly committed to God should therefore be open and ready to forfeit the last of what they possess so that they are able to add meaning or give relevance to the life of another person. This type of giving/generosity/charity/sharing is what is referred to as giving in the name of the Lord or giving in faith because the act undertaken here is inspired by the fear or reverence for Christ or by what someone believes. To be able to give away the last of what we have will sometimes require that we detach ourselves from our possessions and be ready and willing to give them up for the good of others.

SHARING WHAT WE HAVE WILL NOT LEAVE US POORER: The first reading and the Gospel reading today express how two widows performed acts of extraordinary spontaneous goodness. The unique thing about the disposition of these widows is their readiness to help with the last of what they had. Their behaviour in this manner earned them the unlimited blessing of God. They continued to experience the unlimited goodness of God because after giving out the last of what they had, they never lacked again. Generosity is like a candle. One can light one hundred candles from just one lighted candle without the original candle being reduced. A candle can share its light without losing its own. As Christians we can share what we have without becoming poor. In fact, we are likely more highly to be enriched when we share what we have. Hence, a mother loses nothing of her love by sharing it with her children. Likewise, a teacher loses nothing of his knowledge by sharing it with his students. We can share things such as knowledge, wisdom, love, and peace with other individuals without our supply of these in any way being diminished. Giving liberates the soul of the giver. The giver becomes as enriched as the recipient. It is through what we share that we survive.

THE DISPOSTION WITH WHICH WE ARE TO GIVE OR OFFER: How we give matters a lot. The generosity of God towards us is tremendous because he gives us wholeheartedly in abundance and without hesitation at all. What we give in the name of God or directly for the benefit of other should be given freely to God or in the name of God or for the sake of God without reserve or conditions attached. If there should be a reason why a Christian should give it should be because of God and nothing more nothing less. Our reason or sentiments for giving should be free without any condition attached. We should avoid giving grudgingly or with the expectation that we will be recognised or appreciated. Sometimes it is unfortunate that some Christians refuse to give or to help because they do not like someone associated with the organization/group for which they are giving. When we give it should be done simply to please God and not people or even ourselves. When we give we are not to parade our good deeds before others: *"Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father"* (Matthew 6: 1).

Closing Prayer: May the Lord God bless us and help us share with others something of our treasure, our strength, our time, and our talents.
