**DEARLY BELOVED-** Opening Prayer: May we always have confidence and trust in God no matter the situation we find ourselves. God will always love and take care of us.

**INTRODUCTION AND READINGS:** The trust and hope in God who delivers from whatever type of trouble is expressed by the psalmist in the response to the Psalm for today: "You are my inheritance, O Lord, O Lord." Jesus in today's Gospel present the coming days of the Son of man after the tribulation when the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then will the Son of Man be seen coming in the clouds with great power and glory and he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky. This new world order which is described by Christ is what is referred to in the first reading which talks about the time of great distress when Michael the Archangel led many people to experience an everlasting victory. The one who comes in the clouds with great power and glory and sends out his angels to bring together every creature from the ends of the earth is described as Jesus the High Priest who offered one sacrifice for sins and took his seat forever at the right hand of God. Now he waits until his enemies are made his footstool. Therefore, the second reading declare that by the one sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross we obtain forgiveness and sanctification as children of God.

IT IS NOT YET THE END WE SHOULD NOT BE AFRAID: Several individuals have claimed to know precisely when the end of the world will come. Some even claim a special revelation from God or Blessed Virgin Mary, and others again claim to have calculated it from the Bible. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that no one knows when the end will come except the heavenly Father. About the end of the world, we should be hopeful instead of fearful. God made us for salvation, not for damnation. The fact that bad things happen does not mean that the world is ending. Whenever something tragic or awfully bad happens people think immediately that the world is not just falling apart, but they think the world is coming to an end. Horrible things have been happening but the world is still there. Hence, as far as the world is concerned it does not pass away but it is we human beings who do. When human beings die that is the end of the world for them. Today, more than ever many people are not just dying of Covid-19, but many lives are being lost to cancer, heart disease and Alzheimer's. Around the year 2003-2004 many died from SARS (severe acute respiratory syndrome). In the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s millions of lives was claimed by Ebola, and HIV/Aids. In 1918 there was the Great Flu or the 1918 influenza pandemic which killed millions of people. This was after millions of lives was lost to smallpox. This is besides the millions of people who have lost their lives because of diseases like cholera, malaria, tuberculosis, and seasonal flu. What is certain then is that the world is still there. Although it is not the world it used to be since many things have changed, the world has not ended or cased to be. Human beings are the ones who have ceased to be. The world has ended for them. Hence, the world is not passing but it is we human beings who do.

KEEP THE LORD EVER IN YOUR SIGHT - HAVE FAITH GOD: The fact that people suffer and even die does not mean there is no God or God is not in control or that He is unconcerned. The world we live in is an uncertain one and our uncertainty can cause us great fear and anxiety. The Christian needs something solid to rely on and that one thing we need to have during this uncertain and changing world is faith in God. Faith conveys that the world is not heading towards a final catastrophe or heading towards a mere ending. We should have faith in Jesus who triumphed over evil and death. Our end in this world is certain and we should be preoccupied about our own death which is inevitable rather than the end of the whole world, which is out of our hands. Today's psalm rightly put it this way: 'I keep the Lord ever in my sight; since he is at my right hand, I shall stand firm.' Again, we have the words of Jesus: 'Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.' Despite all that we are experiencing, God is always by our side. God is in control and so all we need to do is to place our trust in God. God will fulfil his plan for us. He will take care of us and bring us to everlasting life with him in eternity.

GETTING READY FOR OUR OWN DEATH: The end of the liturgical year reminds Christians to get ready for the life to come so that they will be ready when their time is up. Getting ready for when our own time is up demands that we watch and wait in a state of readiness rather than worrying about the "end-time" events. The parable of the fig tree presented by Jesus warns us to read the "signs of the time" and be prepared to give an account of our lives to Jesus our Judge. The words of Jesus should be taken seriously because we do not know "either the day or the hour" of our own death or of His final coming. When or how this world will end should not be our main preoccupation now. What is important is that we shall leave this world very soon and our eternity will depend on the state of our being when depart this world. So, let us be faithful to God now and serve him with constancy as we live.

> Closing Prayer: May we always be convinced that God will not abandon us come rain come sunshine. God will always be with us and not leave us alone.
