DEARLY BELOVED – **Opening Prayer:** May our preparation for the coming of Christ help us to be good and open to other people and be happy with their achievements.

INTRODUCTION AND READINGS: As we are about to celebrate the coming of Christ into our lives at Christmas we cry out to Jesus our Shepherd and pray hoping that the Lord God will preserve us and look fayourably upon us as the Psalmist echoes in the Responsorial Psalm: "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved." In today's first reading we have the preaching of the prophet Micah who predicted that a day will come when a prince from Bethlehem-Ephrathah, king David's birthplace and the place where his father Jesse belonged would rule over Israel and shepherd his flock. This leader who will shepherd his flock is the Prince of Peace. The woman mentioned is the Mother of the ideal prince, the mother of the Messiah who also is from the dynasty of king David. As we draw near to welcome Jesus at Christmas, the second reading today from the letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews makes us understand that the coming of Jesus in the flesh or in the body was a preparation for his willing sacrifice on the Cross. Hence, as a faithful servant of God Jesus come to accomplish the will of the Father. Just like Jesus who accepted the will of God for him, Mary who accepted the will of God for her goes in hast to Visit Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greetings the baby stirred in Elizabeth's womb and she acknowledged Mary as the "Mother of my Lord" who is blessed among women.

MARY WAS SELECTED AND NAMED TO BE AS UNIGUE AMONG WOMEN: The visitation of Mary to Elizabeth her cousin presents us with some outstanding revelations concerning Mary. Mary's visit to Elizabeth made the child Elizabeth was carrying to stir for joy. This very act of the child stirring in the womb of Elizabeth reveal that Mary was special. Elizabeth herself acknowledged this uniqueness of Mary when she said: "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb." While the child in Elizabeth's womb makes this outstanding revelation about the uniqueness of Mary, the same Elizabeth went on to make another outstanding revelation concerning Mary' total submission to the will of God: "Blessed is she who trusted that the Lord's words to her will be fulfilled." It is for this reason that Catholics honour Mary and have a special place for her their heart.

CALLED TO BELIEVE AND BE BLESSED LIKE MARY: Mary is blessed because she believed and acted on her belief. She became the first and perfect example of a disciple of Jesus. Besides Mary who believed and acted on her belief, there are several other instances in the Holy Scriptures when amazing things happened to those who believed. To the Centurion Jesus said: "You may go; as you have believed, let it be done for you." And at that very hour [his] servant was healed (Matt. 8: 13). To the woman with the flow of blood Jesus said: "Courage, daughter! Your faith has saved you." And from that hour the woman was cured (Matt. 9: 22). To the two blind men, Jesus said, "Let it be done for you according to your faith." And their eyes were opened (Matt. 9: 29). Believing requires thinking and acting on what we believe. Sometimes believing entails hearing the word, working on it and making sacrifices because of it. Faith doesn't always make things easy. Faith will sometimes urge us to persevere and struggle on, often with no assurance of a happy result. An individual who has faith never gives up. If we hear the word of God and act on it we too will be blessed like Mary.

CALLED TO REACH OUT TO OTHERS: Christians are called to know others and this requires that we move out of our comfort zone. The best way to celebrate Christmas worthily is within the context of a family, a group, a community. Hence, the need for us to make the effort to reach out to other and not to just keep to ourselves. Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth should open our eyes to see and realise the need for us to visit those we have deliberately decided to cut off contact with for whichever reason. Christian charity demands that in whichever way we have been offended, that we forgive and forge ahead instead of nursing unnecessary grudges, complaining against each other as if we were created to fight each other and not to be at peace.

CALLED TO BE HAPPY AT THE PROGRESS OF OTHERS: We are to take joy at the progress others make in their lives The visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth teaches us Christian how to also behave towards each other by rejoicing in the good fortune of one another. As soon as Mary learnt that her cousin Elizabeth was with a child, she did not become sad or unhappy but Mary left in haste to visit Elizabeth in order to offer her the necessary assistance. From this we draw the lesion that we should rejoice and be glad when another person progresses and not to remain sad or offended. Filled with the Holy Spirit Mary was moved to do good by visiting her cousin Elizabeth in order to help her out. This motivation to do good is what we are invited to learn. Hence, when we hear of good things happening in the lives of other people we should be moved to celebrate with them rather than feeling sad or complaining or causing or wishing them bad or even praying for their downfall.

Closing Prayer: May God bless us and grant us the grace to receive Christ into our lives and heart as well as have room for others in our lives too.Lord Jesus comes because we have prepared our hearts and lives for his coming.
