

HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: May we sustain and keep unstained the New life of God given to us at our own Baptism.

Introduction to The Liturgy of the Word: The revelation of the glory of God predicted by prophet Isaiah in the first reading: "Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken," is fulfilled when after all the people had been baptized and Jesus had also been baptized and was praying, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in bodily form like a dove and God, the Father acknowledged all that was happening in the words: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." The glory God is made manifest at the Baptism of Jesus when as he who the Son is being baptized, the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity descended upon Jesus while the voice of God the Father confirms the Baptism of Jesus. The Psalm for today speaks to us concerning the glorious, mighty, and majestic voice of the Lord over the waters which will be a source of blessing for the people of the Lord. As we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, St. Paul tells us in his letter to Titus that we are saved through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.

Baptism is Important Since Jesus Himself was Baptized: To treat as odd or to disregard or to water down or to degrade Baptism is completely unchristian since even Jesus himself who never needed Baptism accepted to be baptized (Matt. 3:14; Mk 9: 9-11; Luke 3: 21-22; John 1: 32-34) in order to bring about what is good for us. It is because Baptism is important that the Holy Spirit come down upon Jesus empowering him for his ministry and the Father's voice is spoken to confirm the identity of Jesus as the Son of God (Lk. 1: 35; 2: 49; 9: 35). Since Jesus himself who is Divine and without sin submitted himself to be baptized we who are mere mortals need Baptism most. Let us avail ourselves of Baptism as well as make sure those related to us receive Baptism since through it we are restored, healed, and clothed in light and holiness.

Jesus Submitted Himself to Baptized For Our own Good: Jesus is the obedient Son of God (Hebrews 5: 8-9), who pleases God in all things (Matthew 3: 17) and is without sin (2 Corinthians 5: 21). Since Jesus is sinless he never needed to acknowledge, confess, or repent of any sin and as such Jesus did not need the Baptism of repentance and forgiveness of sins. By submitting himself to be baptized, Jesus lays down the foundation for something good that is for our benefit. Christ's Baptism points to what he will accomplish for our salvation. First, by submitting to be baptized Jesus who is truly human like us identified himself with us humans (Heb. 2: 14) and by so doing shows us that he truly took on human flesh. Since he is truly human like us he allows himself to undergo Baptism in order to show us that our body is important, sacred, and dignified. Second. Jesus also accepted to be baptised to foreshadow his own passion (Romans 6: 3-5) and in obedience to the will of God (Matt. 3: 15: 26: 39). By his humble submission to accepting baptism we see a foreshadowing of the "Baptism" of his bloody death upon the Cross. As the suffering Servant (Isaiah 53), Jesus allowed himself to be numbered among us sinners and submitted himself entirely to his Father's will. By so doing Jesus shows us that we ourselves are to endure suffering and be obedient to God in our lives. Third, the Baptism of Jesus is important and for our own benefit because by agreeing to be baptized Jesus sanctified the waters of the Jordan when he descended into it and the Spirit came upon him. When Christ was baptized he made the waters holy and by his cleansing he purified the waters which he touched. For the consecration of Christ involves a more significant consecration of the water. Fourth, by accepting to be Baptized Jesus goes down into the waters of Baptism in order to bury sinful humanity in the waters. So, bathed in the light of Christ we go down with him into the waters and rise with him to new life. By walking down into the waters of Baptism Jesus the second person of the Trinity took upon himself the guilt, the fear, the pain, and the sorrow of all the people who stood with him in the waters of Baptism. So, as Jesus was baptized, rose from the waters, and come out of it we who are baptized in his name also go down into the river to be buried with him. We are washed in the waters of Baptism and made clean. We rise with Christ to be glorified with him and we come out of the water as new persons with new lives. Fifth, Jesus accepts Baptism for our good because by accepting to be Baptized the heavens that Adam's sin had closed was opened to us. At our Baptism Jesus allows his spirit to descend upon us and lets us to be acknowledged by the Heavenly Father as his beloved children who are loved without any condition or merit.

Closing Prayer: May God bless us and grant us the grace to be beloved sons and daughters in whom God is well delighted.
