## **HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,**

*Opening Prayer: May the Holy Spirit which came down on the Apostles also come down upon us in order to fill our heart, to create and to renew us.*

**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:** The coming of the Holy Spirit promised by Jesus is today made a reality when the disciples who were gathered in the upper room were made to receive the Holy Spirit. The response to the Psalm for today expresses our request for God to send his Spirit upon us: *"Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth."* The request for the Spirit to be sent to renew the face of the earth was fulfilled when tongues of fire parted and come down on the Apostles who were able to boldly speak to the different people of the Mediterranean world, who heard the great things accomplished by God in their own foreign tongues. The Second reading enumerates the various gifts, ministries and manifestations of the Holy Spirit which works in different ways. The Gospel Reading recounts how 50 days after the resurrection, Jesus appeared to the Apostles, gave them the Holy Spirit and the power of forgiving sins.

**Jesus Was Led, Strengthened and Guided by the Holy Spirit:** To value the role of the Spirit in our lives as Christians, we must start with Jesus himself. Jesus himself needed the Spirit. The Spirit had a significant role to play in the life of Jesus. At the very beginning of his life, the Spirit descended on Jesus at his baptism, revealing him as the Father's beloved Son. At his baptism, Jesus received power from on high for the mission he was about to begin. Jesus was not only accompanied by the Holy Spirit for a moment; but the Spirit remained with him throughout his public ministry. Jesus was continually led, strengthened and guided by the Spirit. Jesus began his ministry by making his own the words of Prophet Isaiah *"The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the blind new sight, set the downtrodden free, and proclaim the Lord's year of favor."* Jesus was faithful to that mission statement and he also made the Holy Spirit available to others.

**Jesus gives the Holy Spirit, Sends and Commissions the Apostles:** In today's Gospel Reading Jesus is the one who sends; He is the one who gives the Spirit; and Jesus is still the one who tells them to forgive sins: *"... As the Father has sent me, so I send you."* And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, *"Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained"* (John 20: 21-23). So, Jesus is the one who sent; He is the one who breaths the Holy Spirit on the Apostles as well as the one who tells them to forgive sins. We are the beneficiaries of the Spirit of God and also stewards and administrators of the gifts God.

**Accomplishments of the Holy Spirit in our Lives as Christians:** The Christian is strengthened, inspired, guided, comforted, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit who is God and the third person of the Holy Trinity. The Holy Spirit manifests itself and acts in our lives as individuals and as a group or a community. The Holy Spirit manifested itself and acted in individuals when the formerly timid and frightened Apostles burst out of doors and began to proclaim the Good News of Jesus. A practical example of when people were made to receive the gift of the Spirit which acted in them as a community is when the Apostles were made to receive the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sin (Cf. John 20: 23). The activity of the Holy Spirit is never limited to matters concerning decisions about dogmas and decisions to be made about the life of the Church. First, the Holy Spirit generally performs different activities in the life of every individual Christian who decides to cooperate with the grace of God. It is as a result of the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives that we are sanctified to become more and more like Jesus (Galatians 5: 16-18); the Spirit guides us into all truth/towards the right direction (John 16: 13); we are able to boldly bear true witness for Jesus Christ without fear or shame through the Spirit; as a result of the Spirit we develop an intimacy with God which enables us to call Him 'Abba!' ('Father!') (Gal 4: 6); and the Spirit helps us to pray (Jude 1: 20). Second, the Holy Spirit is constantly at work in our lives as Christians through the sacraments. In the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, the life of the Christian is influenced by the Holy Spirit which makes us new creatures of God who are also able to boldly live and profess the faith without fear or shame. In the eucharist, our faith is strengthened and deepened by the Holy Spirit so that we are able to see Christ present and are able to receive Him. The ordained also receive the Holy Spirit which provides them with the power to make real the mysteries of Christ. Through the sacrament of matrimony, married couples also received the help of the Holy Spirit which gives them the strength and courage to be faithful to each other in marriage while seeking to imitate the union of Christ and His Church. Third, being God, the Holy Spirit gives good gifts and bears good fruits. As divine provider of gifts, the Holy Spirit fills us with different gifts of wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, and speaking in tongues for our better functioning as individuals who make up the body of Christ (Cf. 1 Corinthians 12: 7-11). The presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives also leads to the production of the good fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5: 22-23; Cf. 1 Timothy 1: 9).

*Closing Prayer: Through the help of the Holy Spirit may we profess the faith in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and by so doing come to possess eternal life.*


### CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2022
