


**Christ makes Us Children of God. He Protects us and Satisfies our Hunger and Thirst:** When the Israelites, the children of God of the Old Testament were on their journey to the promised land, after crossing the Red Sea, God provided them with water (Exodus 15: 22-25; Exodus 17: 1-7); meat-quail that flew into camp each evening (Exodus 15: 13); and bread-manna (Exodus 16: 14-32) which landed on the dew each morning. The Lord God led his children with the pillars of cloud-by-day and fire-by-night (Exodus 13: 21). Prior to leaving this earth in order to return to Heaven, Jesus instructed his Apostles specifically to go and make disciples for Him through Baptism: *“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age”* (Matthew 28: 19-20). At the Last Supper Jesus also instructed his Apostles concerning the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist: *“Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me”* (Luke 22: 19). Through the sacrament of Baptism, we become or are made children of God, members of the Church and sharers of the of new life of God. Those who become children of God are also fed and made strong on their pilgrim journey to God here on earth through their partaking in the sacred meal of the Holy Eucharist as they receive Holy Communion. Just as the Israelites, passed through the red sea and entered into the promised land after they were fed by God with manna in the desert and water from the rock, so also, Christians who are on pilgrimage to Heaven are made to become the children of God through the sacrament of Baptism and are fed with the Body and Blood of Christ through Holy Communion.

**Jesus Acknowledged and Taught:** *“For My Flesh is True Food and My Blood is True Drink”* (John 6: 55). Jesus acknowledged himself to be the living bread which comes down from heaven in order to sustain Christians: *“Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: ‘He gave them bread from heaven to eat.’ So Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.”* So they said to him, *“Sir, give us this bread always.”* Jesus said to them, *“I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst”* (John 6: 31-35). When Catholics receive Holy Communion and say they are eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Jesus, questions should not be asked because Jesus had already provided an answer to the question: *“How can this man give us his flesh to eat?”* (John 6: 52). Explaining the nature of His

**Body and Blood as food and drink Jesus reaffirmed:** *“Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day”* (John 6: 53-54). What we eat and drink in Holy Communion is really the Body and Blood of Jesus: *“For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him”* (John 6: 55-56).

**Jesus Left Us His Body as Food and His Blood as Drink:** *“Do This in Memory of Me”* (Cf. Luke 22: 19). It was at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday night that Jesus instituted Eucharist when He used bread and wine: *“Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me.”* And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, *“This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you”* (Luke 22: 17-20; Cfs Matthew 26: 26-28; Mark 14: 22-24, 1 Cor 11: 23-25). It is the Eucharist established by Jesus on Holy Thursday that St. Paul refers to in our Second Reading when he spoke about handing to the people of Corinth the authentic and reliable tradition he had received from the Lord (Cf. 1 Corinthians 11: 23-25). What Jesus celebrated and established on Holy Thursday using bread and wine at the last Supper and commanded that it be continued, is what Jesus predicted when he fed the 5,000 with five loaves and two fish (Cf. Luke 9: 11-17). In the Eucharist, Jesus multiplies His own Body and Blood under the form of bread and wine in order to feed Catholics all over the world each time the Mass is celebrated. During Mass when the words of consecration is pronounced, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the whole of Christ is truly present-Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Since Jesus makes himself present to us in this wonderful way, we need to frequently attend the celebration of the Mass so that we are able to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Worthy reception of Jesus in Holy Communion also requires that we try to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Those who receive Jesus in Holy Communion also need adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament by observing Holy Hour Devotion. Since Jesus who makes Himself present for our nourishment is reserved in the Tabernacle for the sick, the elderly, the dying and for the faithful so that they are able to worship and to pray in the presence of Christ, we need to reverence Christ who is present in our Tabernacles.

**Closing Prayer:** *May the Almighty God bless us and unite us to Christ who nourishes us on our way to our eternal home of Heaven.*




### CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2022
