The Scripture and the One God who Is Creator, Redeemer and Advocate/Comforter: The doctrine of the Trinity means that there is one God who eternally exists as three distinct persons-the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These three persons are one God, same in substance, equal in power and glory and eternally begotten of the Father. The term Trinity is not found in the Bible but the concept is found therein. The Holy Scripture teach us about the unity of God, as being one, that is, God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit as being one God (Cfs. Deuteronomy 6: 4; Mark 12: 29; 1 Corinthians 8: 4; 1 Corinthians 8: 6; 1 Timothy 2: 5). The Holy Scripture refer to each of the three persons in one God individually as God (the Father is God [Cf. Galatians 1: 1], the Son is God [Cf. John 20: 28] and the Holy Spirit is God [Cf. Acts 5: 3-4]). Some passages of the Holy Scripture also present the three persons in one God as being equal in nature to each other, that as associated to each other (Cfs. Matthew 3: 13-17; Matthew 28: 19; 1 Peter 1: 2; Ephesians 3: 14-21; 2 Thessalonians 2: 13; and 2 Corinthians 13: 13). There is also a passage of the Holy Scripture which speak about the diversity of three persons within the Trinity of persons in the one God, that is, they are united but different (Cf. Genesis 1: 26-27).

The Cross as a Statement or Sign of Faith and the Cross as a Sign of the Eternal Love of God for Us: Some Christian denominations like the Catholics, the Protestants and the Eastern Orthodox Church uphold the doctrine of the Trinity. These Churches, especially Catholics mark themselves with the sign of the Cross, using words (In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit) accompanied by actions (touching the forehead at the mention of the "Father;" the lower middle of your chest at the mention of the "Son;" and the left shoulder on the word "Holy" and the right shoulder on the word "Spirit"). We begin to pray as Catholics by invoking the Trinity and signing our bodies with the sign of the Cross. Before the Tabernacle we kneel and bless ourselves: "In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit." We begin the Mass by marking ourselves with the sign of the Cross: "In the name of the Father," We say the grace before and after meal with: "In the name of the Father,..." When we enter the Church we make the sign of the Cross. At the Holy Water Font we bless ourselves and remind ourselves that we have entered into the family of God through baptism in the name of the Holy Trinity. All our prayers begin and end with the invocation of the Trinity. The Mass concludes with those present being blessed in the name of the Trinity. The shape of the Cross, the Cross or Crucifix is a reminder of the symbol of the very Cross on which Christ died for our sins in order to redeem us from eternal death. When we make the sign of the Cross, we express our belief in the Trinity-the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit and also express our faith in the saving work of Christ on the Cross. On Good Friday Christ suffered, was made to carry the cross on which he was crucified, died and was buried but rose from the dead after three days. Since Jesus is God and there is one God who eternally exists as three distinct persons, the death of Jesus on the Cross could be considered as the act of the trinity who are perfectly united with each other: "The atoning act perfected in the Cross of Jesus Christ is grounded in the very being of the eternal God, that is, in the eternal being of the Holy Trinity" (Cf. The Mediation of Christ, 113).

God is beyond Human Comprehension and Understanding: God is God and human beings are created by God. God is beyond human knowledge and understanding and cannot be completely understood because God is bigger than created beings. Human beings are creatures brought into being by God who is bigger and infinite. Human beings who are finite, cannot completely comprehend God who is infinite since all things in heaven and earth came into being through God who is infinite. There is much to be said and discovered about God that the human mind which is finite cannot comprehend about God. God is God and we cannot explain or completely understand who God is, so we should learn to be contented and live with the idea of the Trinity. When human beings with finite and sinful minds desire to be able to understand the thoughts and ways of God completely, it shows that they do not have a high view of God who is infinite. Moreover, if we could understand the mind and ways of God as we desire, it may affect our trust or belief in God as the great sovereign. If human beings had the ability to understand God, they could have created God according to their own liking. Human beings are not equal to God or at the same level with God since God is infinite, sovereign, and Creator: "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55: 9). Since God is much greater, much better, and His ways are greater than our minds could ever comprehend, we should seek to know and be contented with what can be known by the human mind about the Trinity since we deal with a mystery. Let take what we can handle and understand and leave what we can never completely understand to the infinite and great God and wait to be saved by Him.

Closing Prayer: *May we worship, adore, and glorify the one God in three persons here on earth, and come to reign eternally with the One eternal God in Heaven.*

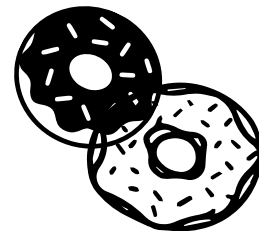

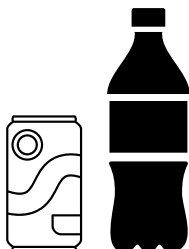
CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2022
