HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: May we always come before the Almighty God in humble prayer simply and freely relating to Him as children interact with their parents.

Prayer is Lifting Up of Our Heart and Voice to God Our Heavenly Father: In prayer we relate to God as children approach their parents. Speaking of God as father has practically the same force as speaking of God as mother. The image of God as father or mother speak to us of a relationship based on trustfulness, confidence, tenderness and intimacy and not on power and authority. Prayer is the lifting up of our hearts and voices to God our Father since this is what Jesus himself taught us: "Father, ..." The first part of the prayer Jesus taught us deals with God. God is a parent to us, and we are his children and so we start by recognizing God's existence and calling him "Father." Then we praise the name of God and pray for the coming of his kingdom-a kingdom of truth and life, holiness and grace, justice, love, and peace. Besides praying for the coming of the kingdom of God we also pray that God may accomplish his will on earth, and in our lives too. The will of God may not always be the easiest thing to do, but it is always the best. The second part of the prayer, Our Father deals with us and our needs. We therefore pray for our daily bread. "Bread" which stands for all our material needs for the day. We pray for forgiveness for our sins and for the grace to be able to forgive those who sin against us, because our inability to forgive others makes it impossible for us to receive the forgiveness of God. Since God does not put temptation in our path, but life does, we continue to pray so that we ourselves do not to fall into temptation. We ask God to help us cope with the temptations that come to us unprepared and to avoid those which we walk into of our own accord. Finally we pray to be delivered from all evil, both physical and moral.

The Right Disposition When we Pray: The request of the disciples to Jesus in today's Gospel reading, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11: 1) can be understood as a quest for the proper disposition for Christian prayer. The disciples of Jesus wanted not only to pray, but they wanted to learn how to properly pray. Since the response of Jesus contains not just a single verse but 11 verses, we can rightly consider Jesus's response as the proper disposition in prayer. Since God is a parent to us, and we are his children, our disposition while we pray should therefore be the normal disposition of a child with his father or mother. This disposition of the child-father relationship in prayer arises from the fact that when the disciple of Jesus asked to him to teach them how to pray, Jesus's response in verse 2 begins with: "When you pray, say: Father,..." and then Jesus ends his response to the disciple's question in verse 13 with the words, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father" (Luke 11: 13). So, going by the response of Jesus we see that prayer according to Jesus is a child-father affair. In other words, it is a family affair based on a relationship of familiarity and love. Just as the child relates with his father or mother with trust, simplicity, frankness, honesty, sincerity, confidence, honestly and openness, so also are we who are children of God to relate to God our Heavenly Father in prayer.

How we Relate to God as Father/Mother when we Pray: Part of the process of speaking to God in prayer as a Father or mother include putting ourselves in the situation where we see God as father or mother and we speak to God as His children. When children speak to their parents, there is hardly a right or wrong way but they relate to their parents freely and in simple plain language. When we pray to God we should simply focus on our prayer intention in our thought or put our thoughts or the desires of our hearts into words or body language. Another way we who are children relate to God in prayer as father or mother is when we present our prayers to God our Heavenly Father, with a spirit of trust and expectancy, knowing that God will always accomplish all things according to our best interest. "Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion?" (Luke 11: 11-12). So, Just as children always trust their parents to do what is in their best interest, we should trust God when we pray and leave all things to him. As children of God who is our father or mother, we should also relate to God with perseverance when we pray. Jesus demonstrates this point about perseverance in prayer with the Parable of the Friend at Midnight who refuses to take no for an answer and still goes on to tell us to ask, seek, knock and never give up when we pray. So, prayer as a father/mother-child affair finally reminds us that prayer is an activity that flows out of a relationship. We do not learn how to pray better, rather we become better women and men of prayer when our relationship with God becomes more intimate like that of father and child. If we want to improve our prayer life, we should focus on improving our personal relationship with God, our Father. We are to trust God as well as insist, never giving up on what we want God to accomplish for us.

Closing Prayer: Almighty God, Our Father, always listen and grant the desires of your children who never lose hope that their desires will always be met by you.

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL '22

Catholic Service Appeal (CSA) provides the financial support for a number of important services maintained by the Diocese of Gaylord. It is expected that the parishioners of each parish will provide the assigned amount of support projected by the Diocese as that parishes' goal.

As of Wednesday, July 20, 2022:

St. Anne has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$14,605 which is 62.4% of our goal. We need an additional \$8,787. To date, 43 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 26.2% of our members.

St. Catherine has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$23,745.00 which is 84% of our goal. We need an additional \$4,359.00. To date 70 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 54% of our members.
