HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: May the fire symbolizing the presence, the power, the glory, the transforming, the purifying, the cleansing and the sanctifying Spirit of God aid us to always be at peace with each other as members of the one family of God.

Jesus did not Come to Cause Tension or Division within Families: "I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled!" (Luke 12: 49). These words of Jesus should not be interpreted literally because they stand for something powerful in His teaching. The teaching of Jesus caused division. He taught that the Kingdom of God was open to everyone-saints and sinners, Jews and Gentiles. He called the Scribes and Pharisees hypocrites and blind guides. They called Jesus a troublemaker and a man possessed. Jesus' sense of justice divided people and also brought him into conflict with those who exploited the weak and the poor. His integrity brought him into conflict with the dishonest. His tolerance brought him into conflict with the narrow-minded and the prejudiced. The many characteristics of fire are warming, purifying, refining, transforming, and burning. The image of fire is used to symbolize the glory of God, His protective presence, His holiness, His righteous judgment, His wrath against sin and the power of the Holy Spirit. All these meanings suggest that the fire which Jesus brings will consume or purify the people in the world. It is also possible that Jesus meant His Baptism will be a Baptism of fire, that is, a Baptism which transforms, cleanses or purifies the lives of His children. Such transformation or refining takes place in the individual and family.

The Need to be Cleansed and Purified of the War that Goes on within the Human Person and Families: Although Jesus is presented in St Luke's Gospel as the bearer of peace (Cfs. Luke 1: 79; 2: 14; 19: 38), in today's Gospel reading Jesus declares himself as the one who come not to bring peace on earth but division: "Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division!" (Luke 12: 51). Jesus describes how in a sense His coming and the message He brought will lead to tensions which will end in divisions even among families related by blood, families related by the waters of baptism and families of the world created by God. Likely, Jesus had the prophecy of Micah in mind when He spoke about division within families: "For the son belittles his father, the daughter rises up against her mother, the daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law, and your enemies are members of your household" (Micah 7: 6; Cf. Matthew 10: 35-36). Belief in Jesus and commitment to him cause fires of arguments to erupt between believers and non-believers in the same family or community, and even in the world leading to divisions among of families and conflicts in the society. Within the human being, particularly within the family disagreement, war, hostility, tensions take place which we must be mindful of. Christ refers to these types of tendencies which takes place within human beings as a war in which evil forces operate within our own persons and in the persons of those who are dear to us (father, son, mother, daughter, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law). These people are not members of different parts of the world, but those who live side by side with each other under the same roof, and in the same neighborhood. Practical examples of evil forces which are at war within the human person and affects families related by blood, water and birth include pride (superiority complex), covetousness (greed, seeking material prosperity at the expense of one's soul), lust (sexual abuse of minors, pornography, treating women as objects of pleasure), anger (bitterness, hate, bearing grudges), gluttony (excessive eating and drinking), envy (self-hate, rivalry), and sloth (seeking success without working for it). These are what we are called upon as Children of God the to declare war against because they eat us up and destroy our relationship with those closest to us in our various families. Jesus, who is God, came purify and cleanse us from.

Jesus Purifies and Cleanses His Children by Fire and the Holy Spirit: On the day of our Baptism, we were presented with a lighted candle and told: "Parents and godparents, this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. This child of yours has been enlightened by Christ. He (she) is to walk always as a child of the light. May he (she) keep the flame of faith alive in his (her) heart. When the Lord comes, may he (she) go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom." After we have been cleansed and made children of God through Baptism, Jesus continues to cast fire on the earth, especially the fire of His Spirit in our hearts through the ministry of Word and Sacraments. The fire of God burning in our hearts inflames us to care, to serve, and to bless each other with the gifts of faith, hope and charity. With the support of God's Holy presence, His power, and His glory, we become that blazing fire that the Lord wants us to be when we open up our ears to hear God's voice. The fire and Spirit of God also opens our eyes to see and appreciate what God is doing in the Church, the world, and our personal lives (Cf. Proverbs 29: 18). Through fire and the Spirit of God our minds are opened so that we obtain the knowledge, wisdom, and understanding of God and his ways (Cf. Isaiah 11: 2). It is also through the fire and Spirit of God that our tongues are opened to praise God, to courageously proclaim the Gospel and to boldly bear witness to the faith with conviction.

Closing Prayer: May God help us to do away with all that brings about worries, tensions, divisions, within our own natural families, in the Church as the family of God and the family of the world at large.

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL '22

Catholic Service Appeal (CSA) provides the financial support for a number of important services maintained by the Diocese of Gaylord. It is expected that the parishioners of each parish will provide the assigned amount of support projected by the Diocese as that parishes' goal.

As of Monday, August 8, 2022:

St. Anne has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$15,465 which is 66.1% of our goal. We need an additional \$7,927. To date, 49 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 29.9% of our members. St. Catherine has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$24,195.00 which is 86% of our goal. We need an additional \$3,909. To date 70 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 54% of our members. St. Gabriel & St. Raphael have both reached there CSA goal in contributions but not in participation.
