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HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: Dear God, increase and sustain our faith in you now and always so that like those who have exhibited great faith we will also live in eternity with you.

Faith in God as Belief, Loving Obedience and Total Commitment to the Will of God: For us Christians, we believe and at the same time express our belief in God by putting our faith in God and his works not just in ourselves, other people or things. Holy Scripture defines faith as: "... the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11: 1). Faith is not just believing that God exists. Faith is demonstrated in real life by our service, our belief, our obedience, and our commitment or submission to the will of God. Although faith and belief are often understood as two separate ideas, nevertheless, they are closely related and could be used interchangeably. A believer (disciple/Christian) is said to believe and have faith in God when they trust God and the many facts about God and at the same time are committed to God in their lives. Belief and faith are used interchangeably in Scripture especially in the fourth Gospel: "But these are written that you may [come to] believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name" (John 20: 31). So, belief and faith are about God and his Son Jesus Christ as well as our commitment to all the things we come to know about God. In the Acts of the Apostles, faith is linked to the acceptance of the word of God: "But many of those who heard the word came to believe and (the) number of men grew to [about] five thousand" (Acts 4: 4); "The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith" (Acts 6: 7; Cfs. Acts 13: 12; 14: 1; 17: 12). The Gospel according to St. Luke also links faith with the hearing of the word of God in the parable of the Sower: "Those on the path are the ones who have heard, but the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. Those on rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no root; they believe only for a time and fall away in time of trial" (Luke 8: 12-13). Faith is also understood by Luke as believing in the person of Jesus, that is, abandoning everything for Jesus and following him: "And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "[Lord,] let me go first and bury my father," "And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home" (Luke 9: 59, 61).

Why the Disciples of Jesus asked Him to increase their Faith: Prior to the request by the Apostles that the Lord Jesus increase their faith, Jesus had just demanded that his disciples forgive their offenders unconditionally and unlimitedly (Luke 17: 3-4). Elsewhere in the Gospel according to Matthew, Jesus' teaching on faith was given in reply to question from the disciples who were not able to expel a demon as Jesus did (Matthew 17: 18-20). Subsequently, the teaching of Jesus about faith and its power is preceded by Jesus' miracle of the withered fig tree (Cfs. Matthew 21: 21, Mark 11: 20-23). So, to meet the demands of being faithful/loyal to Jesus, to believe fully and strongly in his teaching, to strengthen their trust in Christ, the disciples of Jesus asked for more faith. With the type of Jesus' faith, the disciples thought they would be able in the position to unlimitedly forgive their repentant brothers and sisters. Furthermore, the Apostles were asking for greater confidence and trust in God, so that they might also be able to work the miracles which they had seen Jesus perform-like the expelling of the demon or the cursing and withering of the fig tree by a simple command. Jesus went on to use the parables of the mustard seed and the good servant to help his Apostles and us, to understand that for faith to be effective, it must be linked with trust, loving obedience and total commitment to God or active submission to the will of God.

Children of God who Demonstrated Strong Faith: The Holy Scriptures presents us with great men and women who exhibited great faith in the Lord their God. Examples of people of faith in the Old Testament include Abraham (Cfs. Genesis 15: 6, 22: 1-8;); Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego (Cf. Daniel 3: 17-18); Esther (Cf. Esther 4: 16) and Moses (Cf. Exodus 14: 13-14). Example of people who displayed faith in God in the New Testament include the Canaanite woman who refused to allow anything to stop her from obtaining healing for her daughter (Cf. Matthew 15: 21-28); the blind man-Bartimaeus who as a result of his faith shouted for Jesus' mercy even when the people around him tried to stop him (Cf. Mark 10: 46-52); the woman with flow of blood who pushed through a crowd of people because she was convinced that she'd be healed if only she touched the robe of Jesus (Cf. Matthew 9: 20-22); and Mary the Mother of Christ who trusted God when she was chosen to be the mother of Christ (Cf. Luke 1: 35-38).

Children of God are to Grow Strong in Faith! We are called to grow in the knowledge and faith in God. If we want to grow in faith and the knowledge of God, we must work at it by attending to the things that Jesus wants us to do. First, faith is increased by drawing closer to God through prayer. Jesus tells us what to do whenever we are in need: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7: 7). Second, we nourish our faith and allow it to grow when we spend time reading, hearing and studying God's word. Our faith is activated by hearing the Word of God proclaimed by Christ: "Thus faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ" (Romans 10: 17). Third, our faith also increases when as a result of concentrating on the word of God, we remain obedient to its commands and apply them in our real lives (Cf. James 1: 22). Fourth, we grow in faith and knowledge of God by practicing the sacraments, through contact with the believing community and by leading a well-disciplined spiritual life.

Closing Prayer: May our faith in the Lord God be like the faith of the outstanding man and women who have gone before us, so that like them we will dwell with God in heaven forever. **FR. JOHN WILLIAM**

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2022

Catholic Service Appeal (CSA) provides the financial support for a number of important services maintained by the Diocese of Gaylord. It is expected that the parishioners of each parish will provide the assigned amount of support projected by the Diocese as that parishes' goal.

As of Monday, September 25th, 2022:

St. Anne has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$17,720 which is 75.8% of our goal. We need an additional \$5,672. To date, 46 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 28% of our members. St. Catherine has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$27,045.00 which is 96% of our goal. We need an additional \$1,059.00. To date 65 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 65% of our members. St. Gabriel & St. Raphael have both reached there CSA goal in contributions but not in participation. If you have not already contributed or pledged, please do so soon! 
THANK YOU!! ~ K of C Polish Dinner held in Posen on Sept. 11:
