HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: Physically and spiritually walking with the Lord and working for the Lord until the end time when we will have to render an account of our lives to the Almighty and ever living God who will come to judge the living and the dead.

See that You not be Deceived-Terrible Things will Happen but the End of the World is not Imminent: Today the disciples who expressed their amazement to Jesus about how magnificent the Temple in Jerusalem appeared were told it will be destroyed. Truly the city of Jerusalem and the Temple as well were destroyed by the Romans in 70 A. D. and what we are left with today is nothing as before but the Wailing Wall. After prophesying that the Temple will be destroyed, Jesus goes on to say that the whole world too will be destroyed: "He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end" (Luke 21: 8-9). We are not to be misled about the end of the world when faced with incredible physical disasters such as the destruction of the city of Jerusalem and its magnificent Temple, the coming of false messiahs, wars and insurrections, natural disasters like earthquakes, famines and plagues, mighty signs from the sky, and Christians being hated, betrayed, arrested, imprisoned, persecuted and martyred. According to Jesus these dreadful things will take place before the world comes to an end and so when these things happen it is not to be taken that the world is going to end immediately. As it is today, we have nothing of the Temple in Jerusalem except the Wailing Wall. We have experienced and will continue to experience tsunamis, floods, wars, famines, plagues, wrong uses of power and believers are experiencing trials, suffering and persecution. Although Jesus predicted the terrible things that will take place before the world comes to an end, Jesus encourages us that that he will grant us wisdom that comes from on high-the Holy Spirit, that no one can refute and that if we put our confidence in God and endure, we will become victorious: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives" (Luke 21: 19).

See that You not be Deceived-Prepare for the Coming of the Lord: Take care not to be misled because when the world will end is not known to us. First, the world will end one day when we physically die and we hopefully return to be with the Creator-God. So, at the end of our lives when we cease to be, the world will come to an end for us as individuals. Second, the world will end at the Second Coming of Christ, when he will come to judge the living and the dead. Though we do know for certain that we will die and that one day the world will cease to be, when the world will end and when Jesus will return as Judge of the living and the dead is not precisely known to us. Jesus did not tell us when exactly he is coming or the end of the world will be: "But of that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone" (Matthew 24: 36). Besides the fact that the coming of Christ will be unexpected, we are still told that his coming will be followed by judgment as we always profess in the Creed that Christ: 'will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead.' That people will be judged when Jesus comes is clear from our First Reading today which state: "For the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble, And the day that is coming will set them on fire, leaving them neither root nor branch, says the LORD of hosts" (Malachy 3: 19). Since we do not know the day or the hour that Christ will come to judge us we must be prepared at all times. We prepare for the coming of the Lord in two ways. First, we prepare for the Lord's coming by actively doing something spiritual with our life. We are spiritually called to focus on improving upon our relationship with God through worship, prayers, reading of the Word of God, authentic witness by word and deed and the practice of the faith. Second, we also prepare for the coming of the Lord Jesus not by being passive followers of Jesus but by socially attending to our general obligations in life. This will demand that we are able to do all to meet up with our genuine obligations in our families and in our communities both spiritual and temporal.

See that You not be Deceived-Attend to Your Work Diligently and Endure till the End: We are to take care not to be misled because although the world will end, it does not mean we are to sit and do nothing but we are invited to keep on observing all that we are expected to observe, spiritual and temporal. Just as it is that there is no spiritual holiday, neither are we excused from carrying out all that is expected of us because the world will soon come to an end. Apart from working in order to make a worthy living in this world and in the world to come, we are equally expected to persevere till the end and never give up along the way. Jesus on a more positive note tells us his disciples: "Not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls." When we are able to endure till the end we will gain our lives and gain lasting happiness with God.

Closing Prayer: When our Lord Jesus Christ comes at the end of time to judge the living and the dead, may he save us from final damnation and find us worthy of eternal life with him.

BISHOP WALSH'S STATEMENT ON THE PASSING OF PROPOSAL 3

The passing of Proposal 3 in the state of Michigan is a tremendous sorrow for all who recognize the dignity of the human person, created in God's image and likeness from the first moment of conception. I want to thank everyone who made efforts and gave resources to defeat Proposal 3. The pro-life movement has proven resilient in the past, and we will muster the strength to persevere in defending life in new, yet unforeseen ways in the future. As disciples of Christ, our mission must always be to receive life as a gift from God, heal those broken by the sin of abortion, and walk with Moms in need. It is our sincere hope that, despite unjust civil laws, people will choose to follow divine law, and therein find their true happiness.

DAY OF FASTING AND PRAYER IN REPARATION FOR SINS AGAINST THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT ON FRIDAY NOVEMBER 18, 2022

A voluntary (not obligatory) day of fasting and prayer in the reparation for sins against the Fifth Commandment (Thou shalt not Kill) will take place in the Diocese of Gaylord on Friday, Nov. 18, 2022. In our Catholic tradition, every Friday is a remembrance of the day our Lord suffered and died for our sins. In solidarity with our Lord's cross, we are being invited to offer a voluntary fast and prayers to "make up for what is lacking" in the Lord's suffering (Col.1:24). In particular, the passing of Proposal 3, which will enshrine an artificial "right" to abortion in the Michigan State Constitution, cries out for reparation. Fasting from a favorite food or snack and offering a devotion like the rosary or divine mercy chaplet, or ideally going to daily Friday Mass, will unite us to God in His promise that we will have life and have it to the full.

CATHOLIC SERVICE APPEAL 2022: AS OF NOV. 7, 2022:

St. Anne has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$18,380 which is 78.6% of our goal. We need an additional \$5,012. To date, 46 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 28% of our members. St. Catherine has reached in one-time gifts and pledges, \$27,045.00 which is 96% of our goal. We need an additional \$1,059.00. To date 65 parishioners have contributed or pledged to the CSA. This represents 65% of our members. St. Gabriel & St. Raphael have both reached there CSA goal in contributions but not in participation. If you have not already contributed or pledged, please do so soon!
