HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: Jesus continues to teach us in our Churches and even personally where we live alone and work together with others. We are called to charitably seek to live peacefully with each other as children of the One Heavenly Father.

Responding to those who Mistreat us with Mercy, Forbearance and Loving Kindness: As we continue with Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, Jesus today draws our attention about anger, revenge, love of one's enemies and the need to be perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect. Christian are not to return evil with evil (Matthew 5: 39; Romans 12: 19; 1 Corinthians 6: 6-7; Hebrews 10: 30; Leviticus 19: 18; Deuteronomy 32: 35). While human weakness and pride attracts us to react badly towards those who we disagree with, the Divine Master-Jesus tells us that we respond to those who mistreat us with mercy, grace, forbearance, and loving-kindness. For the Christian there is no room for retaliation. Christians are not only to avoid returning evil for evil, but we must seek the good of those who wish us ill. Just as the Divine Master-Jesus accepted insults, maltreatments, beatings, suffering and even death for our sake, His disciples are to endure all forms of maltreatment with the same spirit-no resentment or malice! Rather we are called to respond with a smile-cheerfulness-joy-love-mercy-forgiveness. What makes us Christians as well as Christianity unique is our ability to treat others with loving kindness and mercy not as they deserve. The Scripture is full of passages that asks us to be merciful towards those we consider as enemies. The Lord God commanded the children of Israel to love their neighbor and not to practice revenge (Leviticus 19: 18). A passage of Scripture from Proverbs tells us not to return evil for evil (Proverbs 24: 29). We are also called to exercise love and mercy by feeding the hungry enemy (Proverbs 25: 21). Jesus gives three practical examples of what the Christian charitable behavior should be as it relates to those who mistreat us.

Christian Behavior-Exercise of Non-Violence or Longsuffering: Jesus recommends longsuffering, that is, applying self-restraint when we are stirred to provocation or anger: "But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on [your] right cheek, turn the other one to him as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand him your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go with him for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow" (Matthew 5: 39-42). Jesus is telling us not to retaliate or punish or return evil for evil but to patiently forbear a given circumstance by not giving in to the temptation to react negatively. Longsuffering or non-violence means that we don't allow ourselves to wallow in revenge or anger or get back at people by being abusive ourselves. Jesus enjoins longsuffering on his followers not because they are helpless or because there is nothing they can do about the situation, but because God himself as a longsuffering God was ready to suffer, die for the redemption of the whole world.

Christian Behavior-Exercise of Love and Mercy toward all People: We are called to grow in our love of God and our fellow man. What Jesus is asking us is that we recognize the value of other people and behave well towards them, even though they behave badly towards us. We are to pray for them (Matthew 5: 44), to do good to them (Matthew 5: 55) and to greet them in peace (Matthew 5: 47; Matthew 5: 9), however badly they might treat us. If we love Jesus, we will do what he commands us (John 15: 15), and his command is that we love one another as he loves us (John 15: 12, 13: 34-35). God is not the God of one people only. God is the God of the 'tax collectors' (Matthew 5: 4 6) and the God of the 'Gentiles' (Matthew 5: 47). God is the 'Father' of all: "The Lord is good to all, compassionate toward all your works" (Psalm 145: 9; Wisdom 15: 1). Disciples of Jesus are not to submit to aggressive behaviors from their partner, from their children, or from others in their lives. We need to learn to stop biting back, using our tongue to give vent to our frustration and to get even with those who hurt us.

Christian Behavior-Being Perfect as the Lord God is Perfect: Although the command is to be perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect, nevertheless, this command is possible for us humans because we are called to be perfect in a way that is possible for us humans, that is, in our own capacity as human beings. Perfection is something we start ourselves and allow God to finalize in and through us. Hence, created by God in his image and likeness we become perfect when we know God's will and act accordingly, when we try to love as God loves and to forgive as God forgives. We become perfect as God is by treating others with mercy just as Jesus did, by being non-violent as Jesus was, by not allowing ourselves to wallow in anger or revenge as Jesus, and by showing unconditional good will and universal benevolence as God does. All these we can do only with His ongoing Grace which we need to ask, and then to receive and use. To be "perfect as [our] heavenly Father is perfect" therefore means that in and through us, things are "brought to its end, complete, or perfect." So, to be "perfect" in this sense means to be complete in Christ: "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1: 6).

Closing Prayer: May the Holy Spirit fill our hearts and free us from hatred, violence, revenge and hot temper so that we will be at peace with ourselves and those around us.
