HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: In whatever situation we find ourselves may we recognize that Jesus is always with us and he is ready to guide us through the worst of times to the best of times.

Human Suffering, Sin and Blindness: The question of human suffering is a serious issue in the biblical period and is still a big concern in today's world. In the Old Testament time especially among the Jews, human suffering was seen as God's punishment for sin. Each time the people of the Old Testament saw suffering it was a stark reminder of God's punishment due to sin against him. This made them to have a negative image of God because they saw God as being vindictive. This is the idea behind the question expressed by the disciples of Jesus who asked, "Was the blindness a result of the man's sin or his parents' sin?" The disciples saw the man's affliction as God's punishment of someone's sin, either his own or that of his parents. Granted that people suffer because of sin (Deuteronomy 31: 17-18), nevertheless, not all suffering can be strictly attributed to divine punishment for sin. Although Job did not commit any wrong but suffered enormously, it is the wrong understanding that one's suffering is the result of sin or punishment for sin that made Job's friends to tell Job that his suffering was because of some sin in his life and that he needed to 'fess up and admit it (Job 4: 7-11; 11: 4-6,14; 22: 5). So, Jesus turned down the connection between suffering, sin and even blindness. The man's blindness was not a penalty from God. God does not do evil. God does well. The man's blindness might have been due to something else like genetic defect, poor health practices, accident or some other cause but it is not caused by sin. Rather than give any judgment as to anyone's sin causing the man to be born blind Jesus simply said the man was blind so that the works of God could be put on display and God could be glorified as a result of the mighty works of Jesus. Jesus then proceeded to heal the man's blindness (John 9: 6-7). Rather than being interested in the reason for one's suffering, it is better to just trust the Lord, knowing that "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55: 9). God knows everything and always wants the best for us. God does not benefit in any way when we suffer or are punished. God wants what is good for us who are his children.

Physical and Spiritual Blindness: Besides physical blindness which makes us impossible to see things as they appear to be in reality, there are other senses in which human beings, especially believers are blind and are unable to see spiritually. In a sense we could be blind to the world of God, the world of eternal life/world that does not end or the world of the Gospel. Specifically then, Spiritual blindness deals with those who do not believe in God and His Son Jesus Christ. When a person is spiritually blind, the person is unable to see and understand God, Jesus Christ, and His Word or his message (Romans 2: 8; 2 Thessalonians 2: 12). As a result of not seeing and understanding God or His Son our Lord Jesus Christ, the Christian spiritually perish (2 Corinthians 4: 3-4; Revelation 3: 17) and become lost (John 6: 48-49). Although the Jews attributed the cause of physical blindness to sin, the cause of spiritual blindness is the evil one/devil/Satan. Holy Scriptures is clear about the devil being the cause of spiritual blindness, "In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God" (2 Corinthians 4: 4). The goal of the devil is to devour the weak so that they are tempted and fall into sin. Through Christ the children of God are provided with the spiritual sight to be able to see and follow the commands of Jesus so that they are shielded and protected from the trap of the evil one-Satan. God also helps us to overcome the works of the devil through the Holy Spirit. Jesus heals us from spiritual blindness so we trust in him.

Our Faith Enables Us to See Spiritual Realities and Proclaim Jesus as Lord: To be able to see spiritually we do not need the eyes of our body but the eyes of faith. The eyes of faith helps to illuminate the darkness that exists in the world of God/world of eternal life/world of the Gospel. At Baptism our eyes of faith are opened when we receive the faith and we are able to specifically believe and profess our faith in Lord Jesus Christ. It is therefore not enough for the Christian to believe in Jesus as the Lord or a prophet, or one sent from God. Like the man born blind our belief in Jesus has to transcend all these so that we are able to proclaim that Jesus is "Lord" and adore him as God. Being a Christians therefore has a lot more to do with knowing and following the person of our Lord Jesus Christ. There is the need to enter into a personal relationship with the Lord. The man born blind had a personal relationship with Jesus that is why he arrived at true faith in Jesus before the learned Pharisees. After Jesus seeks him out the man born blind exclaims, "I do believe Lord," and he bows before him to worship him, thus openly recognizing him as his Lord and God. In this way Jesus adds the gift of faith to the gift of sight. Today 4th Sunday of Lent let us try to make up for the times in our lives when we have been spiritually blind as a result of sin. May prayers, fasting and sacrifices serve to heal our blindness and allow us to accept Jesus as our Savior.

Closing Prayer: May Jesus come into our lives during this Lent so that as he made the blind see, the lame walk, and the dead to be raised to life, we will be filled with the faith to see and worship Him as the Lord of our lives.
