HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: May the resurrection of Christ be our hope as we look forward to the day when we will behold God face to face in His glory.

Death is Physical, Spiritual and Social: First, there is physical death. As mortal beings, physical death separates the body from its soul and the person ceases to be. When physical death occurs, there is a definite separation of the life force from the body and there is nothing the human being can do to reverse physical death once it strikes. Second, spiritual death separates the soul from God. Spiritual death is when we sin and become separated from God and eternal life with Him. Adam and Eve were spiritually dead and already separated from God in the Garden that is why when they heard the voice of the Lord, they "hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God" (Genesis 3: 8). We are saved from spiritual death when we trust Jesus and submit ourselves to Him. To overcome spiritual death, a person must accept and believe in Jesus: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3: 16). A person who remain without Christ is spiritually dead. St. Paul describes being spiritually dead as "being alienated from the life of God" (Ephesians 4: 18). Third, there is what can be termed social death. Social death is the isolation and eventual cessation of one's ability to function as a social being. Social death takes place when the human person or persons are set apart from the rest of humanity as a result of some social factors such as terrorism, violence, group hatred, greed, poverty, imprisonment or solitary confinement, chronic illness-dementia and people forced to migrate or live as refugees or in lepers' colonies. Due to any of these the human person is made to come face to face with what is essentially death in another form. In either case, physical, spiritual or social, death reigns in our individual lives and in our communities and so the human being is never free. God does not leave us to languish at the hands of death either physically, spiritually or socially. Through Christ who defeated death on the cross and restored us to eternal life by His raising from the dead, we are saved from our various deaths.

Various People who Died and were Brought Back to Life: Holy Scripture has the total of 10 people who truly physically died and were brought back to life. The Old Testament testifies of the physical death and being brought to life of three people. 1) The Son of the widow of Zarephath (1 Kings 17: 17-24). The Son of the Shunammite Woman (2 Kings 4: 32-35). And 3) The Israelite man whose body touched Elisha's bones (2 Kings 13: 20-21). The New Testament has record of six people (seven with Jesus) who were confirmed to have physically died but were brought back to life: 1) The resurrection of the many in Jerusalem (Matthew 27: 50-54). When Jesus died on the cross, an earthquake broke open many graves and tombs in Jerusalem and many bodies of godly people who had died earlier were raised to life and appeared to many in the city. 2) The Son of the widow at Nain (Luke 7: 11-15). 3) The Daughter of Jairus (Luke 8: 49-56). 4) Lazarus (John 11: 1-44). 5) Tabitha/Dorcas (Acts 9: 36-42). Finally, 6) Eutychus (Acts 20: 7-12). The seventh person who rose from the dead after three days is Jesus (Matthew 28: 1-20; Mark 16: 1-20; Luke 24: 1-49; John 20: 1-21: 25). There is a huge difference between the resurrection of Jesus and the different resuscitations or reanimations listed in the New Testament and even Old Testament. Those who were brought back to life eventually died again and expect be resurrected on the last day. Only Jesus alone rose from the dead in a glorified body never to die again (Romans 6: 9). Like Jesus who died and rose from the dead, those who believe in Jesus will be raised to eternal life with Him after their death. Nevertheless, those who would like to be raised from the dead are expected to believe in Jesus and be hopeful that through Christ they will be raised to eternal life.

Faith in Jesus and Hope in the Resurrection and the Life through Christ: Those who are physically, spiritually and even socially dead cannot help themselves except with the aid of Jesus who is "the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11: 25). Jesus accompanied Martha and Mary, shared their grief, and challenged them to believe: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11: 25-27). When faced with the death of a loved one, faith is our great ally. Although there is nothing we can do once death has occurred, our faith helps us to come to terms with our mortality. Due to the death and resurrection of Christ, death no longer has a hold on us. While faith does not dispense us from the painful work of grieving, it does however add a vital element to our grieving and that element is hope. We look forward with hope that we will be raised and united to Jesus. It is our hope that one day after departing this world, Jesus will reverse our death, raise us from the dead and allow us to enjoy His eternal company in the everlasting kingdom of heaven. Our hope that we will be raised like Christ after our own death is not just a wishful thinking or mere trusting that the dead will be in a "better place." Rather, the Christian hope in the resurrection through Christ is the firm conviction that because Jesus is the resurrection and the life and death is not the end, we can live forever with God in His kingdom. So Christian hope in the resurrection is only with Jesus because apart from Christ, there is no hope in the resurrection to eternal life.

Closing Prayer: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life, Lord Jesus may we come to reign with you in the glory of Heaven.
