HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: We make the words of Psalm 63 our opening prayer: "O God, you are my God it is you I seek! For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, In a land parched, lifeless, and without water. I look to you in the sanctuary to see your power and glory" (Psalm 63: 2-3).

Thirsting for Water and For Living Water Provided By Jesus: Water is a source of life and growth for all living things. Human beings can live without food for several days, but not without water. The Israelites complained about lack of water in the wilderness. By complaining about drinking water instead of trusting and turning to God, the Israelites showed they wanted water more than God. It would have been better for the Israelites to have turned to God and asked Him for water, rather than doubting and rebelling against God. Despite their complain, the merciful, compassionate and gracious God gave his children water from the rock (Exodus 17: 6). Like the Israelites who were thirsty for drinking water, Jesus also weary because he was travelling became thirsty and asked the Samaritan woman for water from the well. Given the antagonism between Jews and Samaritans, the Samaritan woman was surprised that Jesus a Jew was speaking to her and was even ready to receive a drink from her-a Samaritan. At this point, Jesus who initiated the conversation by asking for water redirected the attention of the Samaritan woman to the "gift of God" (John 4: 10). Jesus explained to the Samaritan woman that whoever drinks the living water He will give will never be thirsty because the water He will give shall become a fountain leaping to provide eternal life. Realizing that Jesus was talking about another kind of water the Samaritan woman asked Jesus to give her this living water. The living and eternal water that Jesus talks to the Samaritan woman about is not a "living water" (running water) or ordinary plain water from the tap/well/river/sea, but it is spiritual water which God alone can provide in the hearts of His children. The living water which Jesus spoke of symbolized the Holy Spirit which makes us "new creation" in Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5: 17). It is the role of this same Holy Spirit to also nourish every immortal soul which after death will proceed to heaven. So, the discussion between Jesus and the Samaritan woman was not only about water and thirst for running water, which is physical, but spiritually her souls was thirsty for God. Luckily, the Samaritan woman met Jesus who was able to satisfy her spiritual thirst for God.

Souls that Spiritually Thirsts for God: Numerous persons today yearn for things of greater value. People thirst for justice, truth and love. They yearn for recognition, freedom and security, like the Samaritan woman of today's Gospel. She was oppressed by the prejudice and injustice of a foreign power and crushed by her guilty conscience because she had lived with five different men, looking for freedom and peace. Unfortunately, many people try to satisfy this inner craving of the human heart with material things. Material things can never fill our inner void, because ours is a spiritual thirst; it is a thirst for God. As St. Augustine said, "for you have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." During this Lent, let us allow Jesus to take us to our true thirst and fill us with His eternal life-giving water. So, let us allow ourselves to be led by Jesus during this time of Lent.

Jesus Leads us to A Better Understanding of Himself and Ourselves: Superficially, the conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman seemed to be a discussion between a Jew and a Samaritan woman. However, at a deeper level it is about a journey where Jesus leads the woman into a deeper faith and understanding about who He is until she was able to experience his love and mercy. At first, the Samaritan woman did not believe in Jesus but referred to Him casually as "a Jew." After Jesus had spoken to her about living water, the Samaritan woman referred to Jesus as, "Sir," three times. When Jesus made her realize that He was fully aware of her life and that she was in her sixth marriage, the Samaritan woman went on to acknowledge Jesus as, "a **prophet.**" When Jesus told the Samaritan woman that the time has come when all worship will be superseded by worship animated by the Spirit, she hesitated saying, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Anointed; when he comes, he will tell us everything" (John 4: 25). Immediately Jesus admitted that He is the Messiah (John 4: 26), the Samaritan woman believed Him and left her water jar and went into town and invited her towns people telling them, "Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Messiah?" (John 4: 29). Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in Jesus because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me everything I have done" (John 4: 39). After the villagers had seen and heard Jesus for themselves they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world" (John 4: 42). Jesus led the Samaritan woman slowly and gently to faith in Him as the Christ. Jesus reached out to her, listened to her, accepted her as she is and freed her from lack of self-belief, self-worth, from the experiences of the past and the prejudices of the present. Since Jesus did all these she not only declared that He is the Messiah, but goes out and evangelized her towns people who affirmed Jesus as truly the **Savior of the world.**

Closing Prayer: As disciples the one Father in Heaven who thirst for living water, may we turn to Jesus, listen to him, hear his words and acknowledge as our Savior.


LENTEN FISH FRY EACH FRIDAY:
