## HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

**Opening Prayer:** Today, with great joy we celebrate the triumph of love over death. Since Jesus is alive and dies no more, may we rise from our tombs and be privileged to enjoy everlasting life with Jesus in his Holy dwelling place.

Jesus Is Truly Risen: As we celebrate Easter Sunday, the day Jesus come back to life after he was crucified, died and was buried. we are joyful. What gives us joy is that Jesus Christ is risen from the Dead. The resurrection of Jesus gives us joy because it proves that Jesus is truly God. We celebrate and are filled with joy today because by his resurrection Jesus has fulfilled all he had said about his suffering, death and raising from the dead. We are joyful still because the victory of Jesus over death is also our own victory. By coming back to life, Jesus has been able to restore us to life, just as by dying he destroyed our death.

Three Things that Show us that Jesus Christ Rose from the Dead: The resurrection of Jesus is denied by some people. The truth of the matter is that today's readings testify that Jesus died and rose from the dead. Today's readings, especially the Gospel Reading present us with three events which show that Jesus who suffered and was crucified on the cross, rose from the dead.

First, the fact that Jesus was certainly buried and his tomb was found empty show that Jesus who was crucified rose from the dead. Jesus's body was not stolen as purported by some people because it was never found. Moreover, the grave of Jesus was secured with a stone and with soldiers after he was buried, so how could his body have been stolen. The presence and position of Jesus's burial clothes is also another evidence that he rose from the dead and his body was not stolen. If Jesus's body was stolen as alleged, the burial clothes could not have been left behind and carefully folded by the side. Who will even steal a dead body and leave the burial clothes?

Second, another evidence that Jesus rose from the dead is the simple explanation by Mary Magdalene that Jesus is risen, he is not there in the tomb. At least it is a fact that there was a certain woman who goes by the name, Mary Magdalene and that she was the one who found the tomb empty. Although she did not experience the real moment of the resurrection of Jesus from the tomb, nevertheless, it is a fact that she was the first to go to the tomb very early in the morning and when she did not find the body of Jesus, she ran to the disciples to tell them of the empty tomb. Peter who was confused ran to the tomb to see for himself. John also went and when he saw the empty tomb, he believed. Eventually, all of the Apostles themselves come to understand and believe.

Third, Jesus who suffered, died and was buried, truly rose from the dead, and transformed the lives of his disciples who boldly proclaimed that he was risen. After the Resurrection of Christ, the disciples, who were at first paralyzed with fear of being arrested as accomplices of Jesus, suddenly made a complete turnaround and began to boldly proclaim that Jesus, was alive and with them. Their experience of the Spirit of the Risen Lord gave them unshakable courage that made them ready even to die for the truth that Jesus is risen and is alive. Even when they were imprisoned, they rejoiced and became more committed to witnessing to Jesus and sharing in his sufferings that they might share in his glory. Peter testified that Jesus rose from the dead and St. Paul also admonished the early Christians to set their hearts on what is above where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.

Believing and Proclaiming Christ Crucified but Risen from the Dead: People can believe what they want to believe, but the truly great thing for the Christian is to believe that Jesus is risen. Instead of engaging ourselves in arguments that try to prove Jesus did not resurrect, it's far much better to allow ourselves to be moved by faith in the resurrection like the early disciples who after the resurrection of Jesus Christ were radically changed and begin to proclaim Jesus crucified and risen from the dead. Just as the disciples became people of faith and testified to the resurrection of Christ, so we too who today are disciples of Jesus are called to witness to the resurrection of Jesus by believing and proclaiming it. One of such early testimony to the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is St Paul's declaration: "For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: That Christ died for our sins, according to the Scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he rose again according to the Scriptures; and that he was seen by Cephas, and after that by the eleven. "Then he was seen by more than 500 brethren at once, of whom many are still with us and some are fallen asleep. After that, he was seen by James, then by all the apostles. And last of all, he was seen also by me, as by one born out of due time" (1 Corinthians 15: 3-8). Faith in the resurrection and proclaiming it is better than indulging in arguments as to whether Jesus rose from the dead or not, because even the angel who appeared to the women on early Easter morning said to them: "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" (Luke 24: 5). If the Jews and the Romans do not deny there was a Jesus who they crucified on the cross of Calvary, why should the resurrection of the one who they certainly crucified be a problem to them or even us? Since Jesus is now alive and at work in his people and in his Church, instead of dwelling on arguments as to whether Jesus rose from the dead or not, it's better to believe in the resurrection of Christ and be dedicated to proclaiming the Kingdom of God which Jesus came to establish among us so that we will be saved.

Closing Prayer: May Jesus Christ who is truly risen from the dead and has brought us eternal life help us to remain faithful to him now, and at last come to behold him face to face.
