HOLY AND INNOCENT CHILDREN OF GOD,

Opening Prayer: We believe and look forward in hope that we will be united with Jesus who will certainly return to take us to live with him in the glory of heaven.

The Ascension of Jesus into Heaven: The Gospel according to Mark, Luke, the Acts of the Apostles and the letter of St. Paul to Timothy testify to the Ascension of Jesus Christ into heaven (Cfs. Mark 16: 19-20; Luke 24: 36-53; Acts 1:6-12; 1 Timothy 3: 16). The First Reading today from the Acts of the Apostles tells us of the Ascension of Jesus when he was taken up into heaven in the sight of his followers. Not realizing what had happened to Jesus, his followers who continued to gaze up into heaven were told by two strangers that the Lord had returned to heaven. This transition of Jesus from earth to heaven marks the end of the life of Jesus here on earth and his exaltation at the right hand of God in heaven. Since Jesus ascended into heaven, it means that all the events that preceded his ascension such as his conception, his birth, his earthly ministry, his passion, his death and resurrection are true. The ascension of Jesus into heaven is also another proof that Jesus really appeared to his disciples many times after his death and resurrection. The Ascension of Jesus is also another basis for believing in the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the Second Coming of Jesus at the end of time. Now that Jesus has returned to the glory of the Father in Heaven the task before us his disciples is to believe Jesus and make ourselves busy with the work he has left us instead of idly watching for his Second Coming.

The Ascension of Jesus Reminds us of our Going to Heaven to be With Jesus Christ: Some passages of the Scripture which refer to the ascension of Jesus include: "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself" (John 12: 32) and "But from this time on the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the power of God" (Luke 22: 69). Another statement of Jesus which undoubtedly reminds us of his ascension into heaven is his words to Mary of Magdala: "Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God" (John 20: 17. These statements of Jesus find complete fulfilment today as we celebrate the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord to heaven. Since Jesus has returned to heaven, it is our Christian hope that one day we will go to heaven to be with Jesus. With confidence, we continue to pray the prayer Jesus taught us "Our Father who art in heaven." We do not only pray to our Father who art in heaven but we also proclaim that Jesus "ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." Jesus "is seated at the right hand of the Father," means that as man Jesus entered God's world; that he has been constituted the Lord and head of all things, as St. Paul says in the second reading. When comes to us, "going to heaven" or going to "paradise" which is the desire of every Christian means going and being "with Christ" (Philippians 1: 23). Our heaven is the risen Christ together with whom we shall form a "body" after our resurrection. The Ascension of Jesus guarantee us of an eternal fellowship with Jesus: "For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first" (1 Thessalonians 4: 16). Jesus did not just ascend to heaven to be with God, but he returned to heaven to prepare a place for us so that we could join Him. Having gone into heaven in His resurrected spiritual body, we too will be opportune to join our Lord Jesus Christ so that where the head is the body will also follow. As we prepare ourselves to join Jesus in heaven, our business here on earth is to believe and follow the mission of Jesus. We are to strive to bring the Gospel to the ends of the earth, making new children for Christ through baptism in the name of the Trinity and teach all to observe the command of Jesus.

The Ascension of Jesus Marks the Beginning of the Reign of the Holy Spirit: The prayer we say to the Holy Spirit is an invitation to God to fill our hearts and minds so that all our thoughts, words and actions will be directed according to the will of God. While we pray to be filled with the Holy Spirit, the solemnity of the ascension of our Lord into heaven marks the beginning of the presence of the Holy Spirit among us human beings. The ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ into heaven opens the door to the Holy Spirit so that it comes and makes its dwelling within those who have been baptized into the Body of Christ. The ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ is not his departure from us or the end of his life with us who live here below. Jesus' ascension into heaven is a new beginning. Jesus after his ascension remains with us in a new way through his Holy Spirit so that he will dwell with us always. In his humanity Jesus became one like us and full of every grace and goodness. Now that Jesus has gone to heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father in the fullness of divinity, he comes to us in the power of the Holy Spirit and remains with us always. The unique presence of Jesus with us through the Holy Spirit helps us to become fearless or courageous so that we can publicly and boldly live and bear witness to our faith in the world in which we live.

Closing Prayer: Since Jesus has preceded before us into heaven, we pray that we who look up to him in faith, hope and love will be united with him in heaven.
